A View from the Rectory





I took these photos using a 1200mm lens, in a gale, on a bright February morning, on the sands opposite the Seal Colony at Newburgh, Aberdeenshire. This secluded headland is home to 3000+ seals. However, you never know whether they will be there or away in the depths of the oceans. You may see them, hear haunting, melodic songs carried on the wind one day - then nothing, not even a bobbing, Labrador-like head peering at you with unabashed curiosity the next. Grief and loss hit every one of us in some form or another and I know there are many, like me, who are feeling keenly the loss of someone from our Benefice, our lives, our families. As I stood there on that shore it reminded me of what it feels like to face the death of someone loved. I think it feels like peering across those waters, hopeful of spotting the throng, the multitude we know are there. Knowing the solidity of the promise of a new beginning, the hope of that new world that lies beyond death, yet unable to walk that land or go where they go, see what they see - yet. And it struck me that the shore itself remains, that solid ground. I rested my feet firmly on this shore, propped the huge lens on the top of a lump of WW2 concrete barrier, (forgot my tripod!) and looked across the expanse. The seal pup seemed close enough to touch and yet I was so far removed I might as well have been in Australia. And the shore beyond? I see it somehow as the solid ground of God, who is Love, and we can trust our loved ones rest upon it. They see as St Paul writes

1 Corinthians 2:9, but as it is written,

"What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, ...nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him."

So on the days you go seeking God, your loved ones and answers, remember the seals and hold fast to hope - for beyond the beach is a 'shore upon which every one of us will stand', where there is 'only Love'.

RE-ORGANISATION OF PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCILS WITHIN THE UPPER KENNET BENEFICE

A Working Group (involving a member from each parish) was set up to look at the merit of merging our current 5 PCCs within the Upper Kennet Benefice into one PCC. After 4 years of work they recommended that this should go ahead. Individual PCCs were given the opportunity to vote on this recommendation and all 5 agreed that this proposal should go forward to the next stage. This next stage involved consultation with the clergy, PCC secretaries, patrons, Rural Dean, Lay Chair and Archdeacon. No

objections on liturgical grounds were submitted. The Bishop of Salisbury agreed that this proposal should be put forward and the Church Commissioners have initiated a round of formal consultation, which is open to the public, to run for 6 weeks. To this end there will be 2 meetings, open to all, where the Working Group will outline the proposal: Mon 17 April at 7.30-8.30pm at Winterbourne Monkton Community Hall and Sunday 23 April 3.30-4.30pm at West Overton church.

Should agreement be given to merge into one PCC there will be no difference to church services and pastoral support throughout the benefice and individual church funds will be ring fenced.

If you wish to know more, please come to one of the meetings. Any objections to the formation of a single PCC will need to be addressed to the Church Commissioners and details of their address etc will be available at the meeting.

VACANCY

Avebury has a number of distinct communities and ideally they would all be represented on the Parish Council so we would particularly welcome applications from residents of Avebury Trusloe, Rawlins Park or West Kennet but all parishioners are encouraged to apply.

To be eligible to apply to be a local councillor you must be:

- a UK or Commonwealth citizen (which includes a British subject) or be a citizen of the European Union.
- at least 18 years old. an elector of the local council; or in the past 12 months occupied land or other premises in the area the local council serves (as owner or tenant); or work in the area local council serves (as your principal or only place of work);

or live within three miles of the local

council boundary.

Defibrillator scheme: A fourth defibrillator has been installed at Galteemore Farm, Beckhampton. APC would like to thank all local residents who contributed towards the fund to obtain it, Avebury Community Shop for the balance of the funding and Rob Hues for arranging its installation and a donation towards the cost of that.

We are hoping to be able to install another machine in Rawlins Park and are in contact with the owners about this.

Avebury Chapel: The lease has now been signed and we are hoping that the chapel will be open in the spring for visitors to view the exhibition there titled 'The Living Landscape' featuring displays from local conservation, walking and history groups. There several talks on local points of interest are being arranged.

Policies: we are in the process of reviewing a number of policies that APC has and will be highlighting them over the next few months.


NEWS FROM THE TOWER

Spring is nearly here and ringers are returning to their towers in droves. On the 28th February, there were 12 ringers for practice at Avebury. Having 8 bells meant that only 4 ringers had to sit out for each ring. 7 ringers rang for the Benefice Communion and Commissioning service on 12th March. The service was to license Lay Readers, e.g. Alison Andre was licensed as a Lay Chaplain, by the Archdeacon.

Most people don't think about what goes on inside the church tower. After climbing up the stone stairs to the first floor there is the ringing room. Next comes the clock room. Brian winds the clock by hand every week. The third room houses the 8 bells plus renovation job involving the fitting of new the old tenor bell which is hung 'dead'. It is connected to the clock and strikes on the hour. The final door leads to the roof. 

More Lottery Support for the Kennet Valley Hall Green Energy Project

Having supported the Hall Committee's major Ventilation Project in 2021, National Lottery Funding will now provide a further grant of £10000 to support the Hall's current plan to install a Solar Energy System.

The first part of the Hall Committee's efforts to create a sustainable energy policy was to incorporate an Air Source Heat Pump within the 2021 Heat Recovery Ventilation System. A new initiative is now underway to develop a Solar Energy System incorporating the use of storage batteries which can be charged from both solar and cheaper overnight electricity.

It is anticipated that the two initiatives combined will help the Hall Committee in their efforts to maintain current letting rates despite the

current trend for higher prices.
