A View from the Pew

We are now entering Advent, a time of recalling messengers from God telling of the birth of Jesus, we hear of the journey of Joseph and Mary travelling from their homeland culminating in the actual birth of Jesus.

AVEBURY SOCIAL CENTRE

The Trustees of the Centre met on October 21st 2021. General maintenance was discussed, in particular a working party to address the clearing of the garden and the ivy around the Social Centre on Saturday 20th November 2021. Two loose tiles on the roof had been fixed. It was agreed that ten new small tables be purchased for use at a possible music evening or for other social gatherings. An alcohol licence was discussed but it was agreed that this remain being purchased for individual events. Michael Daley as Treasurer gave a very comprehensive report including the acceptance of a grant for an Energy Audit to be undertaken, once this was done it would help the Committee decide on how best to improve the heating/insulation of the Centre, and apply for a grant. A suggestion was made that it might be nice to hold a soup and cheese event on a monthly basis for locals to meet up for an informal lunchtime chat, details were yet to be decided but the Trustees were keen to support the idea, and to monitor the support for such an event.

The next meeting of the Trustees will be in January 2022.

Avebury Parish Council Headlines from Avebury Parish Council's

meeting on 2 November 2021

Local issues: We considered a draft budget for next year and confirmed that the play area project would be the most important item for us. We decided to hold a **village meeting** in the second half of January to discuss plans for the play area with the wider community. The budget is due for approval at our December meeting. We heard about concerns relating to traffic and car parking in Trusloe and, subject to the views of residents living there, agreed to consider applying for a speed limit restriction of at least 30mph in place of the current national limit (60mph) in connection with the revamping of the play area. We agreed in principle to lease a **defibrillator** for Beckhampton, encouraged by significant fundraising in the village. The proposed Community Exhibition Space in the Chapel has attracted expressions of support from a wide range of organisations. We heard that there had been a **serious crash** at the junction of the B4003 and the A4361 and agreed to support the Highways Improvement Request made to Wiltshire Council by the resident involved in the incident. The request asked for a WHS-wide speed limit of 40mph except where already lower. We have been told that Wiltshire Council has added repainting of the white lines at this junction to their work schedule for 2022. Wiltshire Council hopes to repair the severely delaminated surface of the A4361 above the Beckhampton roundabout next year ahead of resurfacing due in 2025. We received an update from the National Trust detailing Christmas and New Year opening plans.

Planning applications: We reviewed an application for work to many trees on the National Trust estate and decided to ask for further details.

Dates of next meetings: The next meeting is on 7 December at 19h30 in the Social Centre. As always, residents wishing to participate are most welcome to do so.

Vacancy: We have a vacancy on the Council. Please consider applying for it! Liz Moore (clerk@aveburyparishcouncil.org) or any of the Councillors will be glad to answer your questions.

Defibrillators

Following the installation of the defibrillators in our villages the Parish Council has arranged for a public training session for local residents to be provided by the South West Ambulance NHS Trust on Sunday 23rd January 2022 from 10 – 11.30 am at Kennet Valley Hall. Up to 40 places will be available to allow for social distancing as required by the NHS. Please do join us and learn how to use the defibrillators - you could save a life in an emergency.

Lockeridge Speed Limit...

When we ask around it's surprising to discover how many people who regularly drive through Lockeridge still don't know that the speed limit is 20mph. This is particularly important when the winter sun is so low.

Dog walkers and cyclists please be aware that you are much safer wearing Hi-Viz on dark winter afternoons. As Thames Water upgrades the Fyfield Sewage Treatment

Work over the next six months driving up and down Church Lane, they want to encourage walkers and their dogs to keep safe by wearing Hi-Viz.

Dog Waste bin

The Parish Council has provided a new dog waste bin in West Overton at the top of Forge Lane at the entrance to bridleway WOVE40. This area has been problematic for some time where owners have been allowing their dogs to foul the bridleway. We would like to remind you that it is an offence not to pick up after your dog and, if caught, you can be fined. It is also extremely dangerous for livestock and can be fatal. Please either take it home or put it in one of the bins provided.

HEDGES

Now the evenings are getting darker much earlier, and the leaves are falling please can

you remember to cut back hedges. This is vitally important on land bordering roads and pavements as the leaves become very slippery when wet and the overhanging hedges force pedestrians into the road where they may not easily be seen by oncoming vehicles. Please do not be surprised if you receive a letter from the Parish Council making this request but we hope by giving you a gentle reminder now this can be avoided.

QUEENS JUBILEE

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee is due to take place on 2nd June 2022. At the last Jubilee members of the villages rallied round and organised a spectacular event which was very well attended and was an occasion which brought the whole community together. The Council would be interested to hear from anyone who would be willing to organise the event and also anyone willing to be part of a team of helpers. NEWS FROM THE TOWER

Brian Vickers wrote the following.

Remembrance Sunday bell ringing took place under the new Union Jack flag (kindly given by an unknown donor). The following rang Rounds, Call Changes and a Plain Hunt. Sean, James and Samuel Tye, Michele and Adam Lomas, Jonathan Stubbs and Brian Vickers.

Ringing was not allowed during Lockdowns, but as it was lifted this year we resumed with everybody wearing a mask and ventilated by opening the window of the ringing chamber and leaving the downstairs entrance door open to the Church interior. The upstairs door was left open when not ringing (talking and two rounds of sweet eating) but had to be shut due to excessive noise during actual ringing. Following the first frosts we started using our two electric heaters, which are quite effective in warming the chamber when it is shut up before ringing and can still be felt when it is opened for up for ringing. Warm winter clothes are also worn! The ropes get stiff to use in cold damp weather, so we have resumed use of our simple rope heater - where the lower 6 foot or so of rope is put in something like an 8 inch diameter tube warmed at the bottom by a 60 watt bulb (no high tech LED's for us). This is surprisingly effective in softening the ropes; indeed if it is left on for much more than 3 hours the ropes start to become rather slippery to handle easily.

Finally we have been practising on Tuesday evenings for the last few months. New ringers welcome as always!

Marlborough Stitch



After leaving school Bobby's first job was making glamorous theatre costumes and after a few years in industry she trained and went on to teach at a secondary school. In 1986 she moved to South Shropshire, taught City & Guilds Design courses and got involved with school and community projects. Bobby then went on to talk about the Moor Hall Studio where she offers a great variety of textile and art related courses.

During a visit to Uganda Bobby set up project for the local community which included basketry, making brooms, mats and making bark cloth. This experience has inspired a lot of Bobby's work.

Ofsted 'Good school' – March 2020 News from November 2021

October and November have been busy months at the school, and it is wonderful to feel the busy buzz in all of the classrooms

Harvest Festival

In early October we held our Harvest Festival, to think about and show how thankful we are for the lives we have. This year we collected food for Love Marlborough Kids Meals, which is a fantastic local charity that we supported during the last lockdown. All the children took part in the festival service, which was filmed so that parents and carers could watch at home. I know that the class teachers and TA were very proud of the children in their classes. Thank you to all the parents who sent the donations in to school.

School Educational Trips

Our youngest year groups, in Wrens class, have been very curious as they have been on a Science trip The Lookout Science Discovery Centre, where they developed their curiosity by looking at various aspects of science. The Lookout Centre was designed for younger children, so they had a superb day there together. They also took part in a workshop there to find out more about living things. This class has also been invited to Marlborough College Science department to take part in some science investigations together – I will tell you more next month!

The oldest children spend a day at Go Ape in Bracknell. This day was designed to help them to continue to build their resilience and to take part in a range of team building activities. Mrs. Byford, their class teacher, said "It was amazing and fascinating to watch the children work together to overcome their nerves to complete the tree climbing activities. They all achieved so much, and I am proud of them all."

Year 4 set off together for their 3-day residential. They went to Charterhouse, which is near Cheddar. While they were there, they took part in rock-climbing activities, caving, gorge walking and rocket building. All the staff that went with them were incredibly impressed by the children. Mrs. Alexander said "We were enormously proud of the children this week. They were well behaved, looked after each other and were a joy to spend time with." Miss Hogan added "The children were amazing – they all attempted every activity and when they needed to, they really dug deep and kept

on going. Well, done Year 4 – you were AMAZING."

As a school we try to use the local area as much as we can. This year Wrens class (Reception and Year 1) are going for a weekly walk in the village. They often go to West Woods or to The Dene and use these walks to extend the learning from the classroom. In addition to these walks, Wrens and Kingfishers classes have both been for trips to Avebury. These trips linked with their history work and the children (and staff) all really enjoyed the mornings there.

After-school clubs

At Kennet Valley we have excellent wrap-around care in the form of our Dragon Breakfast Club and our Dragon After School club. These are run by Mrs. Helen Bushnell and Mrs. Ruthie Marsh, who both work in the school in other positions as well. This means that they know the children who come to the clubs well and they are both focused on our children having a fun time at both clubs. This year we have also been able to run more after-school and lunchtime clubs than we have done in the past 18 months. In term 1 and 2 we have run a Science Club, several sports clubs, and a Christmas cookery/craft club. We also have a philosophy club called 'Little Big Thinkers' which is run by one of our Governors.

Volunteer Readers

Reading is especially important to us as a primary school. The staff team work together to make sure they choose high quality texts for the children to read in Guided Reading sessions and as class novels.

We are incredibly grateful that we have several volunteer readers, who come in every week to listen to our young people read. These volunteers are a mix of current or past parents and people from the local community. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all these volunteers for their help and support. If you would like to help in the school with reading, please contact the school.

Book Sponsorship

This year we are running a book sponsorship scheme. This means that people linked to the school, such as parents, governors or local residents can sponsor books or story sacks for the school. Miss Hogan

This year the staff team welcomed a new member – Miss Joanna Hogan. Miss Hogan has recently qualified as a teacher, and we are pleased that she now works with us at Kennet Valley. I know that the Year 4 and 5 children are loving her being their teacher as she is so kind and caring.

On asked about joining the school Joanna said "I am really delighted to have joined Kennet Valley C of E VA School in September, and I enjoy teaching the Year 4 and 5 class. I was particularly pleased to be able to start my teaching career in a village school where I value the supportive team. The Christian ethos at the school is important to me, with a caring Christian community here.

From a young age, I knew that I wanted to work with children. Before taking up teaching, I was a Norland nanny for 10 years and was lucky enough to work in many countries. From experiencing a variety of working placements through Norland College, I discovered that my long-term aim was to be a teacher. Last year, I completed my PGCE with Bath Spa University and am excited for this new adventure.

I particularly enjoy outside activities and exploring countryside walks with my dog, Molly."

I speak for the whole staff team and all of our children when I say a huge thank you to Joanna, for the hard work and commitment that she is already showing to our lovely village school.

Christmas at KVS

At this time, like many of you, we are all looking forward to the Christmas festivities. At the school we are having to continue to do things differently than we did prior to Covid-19 but are still looking forward to many activities like our Nativity Plays, Singing Carols and Songs to the parents, and making Christmas crafts to take home. We will also be going to the Watermill Theatre to watch their production of The Jungle Book.

The letters of thanks are with Derek and he would be happy to show them to anyone who is interested.






