A View from the Rectory

Coming to Christmas

There was no Christmas 2000 years ago. The land currently devastated by the events of the past two months was a land under occupation by Roman soldiers, and the journey of a betrothed couple - expecting their first child - in response to an edict from a foreign emperor was just 'one of those things'. Within two years that child and his family would be refugees in Egypt, fleeing the murderous intentions of a despotic 'puppet' king intent on eradication of any threat to his power and position.

Innocents suffered then. Innocents suffer now. We feel deeply for all of them, caught in a prison of violence and hatred whatever their nationality, faith or heritage. Many of them will not celebrate Hanukkah or Christmas, whether the miracle of an end to war occurs or not, just as many across Ukraine and Russia will not be free to enjoy what many of us take for granted. The freedom to choose to gather with others, and be together in our ancient churches that have held the joys and fears, the unanswered questions and great triumphs of our village communities, for over 1500 years. The freedom to experience a sense of something special in the air, something of the angels bending 'wings of gold' to earth and singing songs of peace; something of the hope that lay in a child's birth, and a man's death gave the promise of more beyond this world's brief life. At a recent Ministry Team meeting we were talking about how hard we make it for people to do just this and the inherent anxieties that stop people coming into our churches; we felt we wanted to make it really clear this year when so many are excluded from their own places of worship through war, destruction, terrorism and violence that the Inn is open, the room to 'be' is ready, and no... you don't have to sleep in the cow shed!

These words from the carol 'It came upon a midnight clear' and the eternal sadness of repeated history are especially poignant this year, and it is important we take every opportunity to give thanks for so much freedom we enjoy, the choices most of us have.

But with the woes of sin and strife
The world has suffered long;
Beneath the angel-strain have rolled
Two thousand years of wrong;
And man, at war with man, hears not
The love-song which they bring; —
O hush the noise, ye men of strife,
And hear the angels sing!

'And hear the angels sing' - so here it comes, a golden invitation to come together, sense the something special, and listen for the song that triumphs over war - the 'peace on earth' sung by the angels and sung again in our churches this Christmas.

News from the Tower

Ringing at Avebury in October was bedevilled by the holiday season continuing – to the point that the practice on the 17th was cancelled when only 4 ringers said they could ring and on 24th when only 5 offered. Also as mentioned before, ringing at Avebury is presently rather dependent on ringers coming from outside the village, In days of old when more ringers were local, low attendances such as those above did not stop practices. Ringing for a few means that there is plenty of chance to ring; teaching can be concentrated on individuals, and an early finish can be made if desired. However today, when some ringers drive from All Cannings and Heddington, they cannot be expected to come in wintry weather to a poorly attended session which might finish early. However, all is not lost. We had 7 ringers at practice on 31st Oct, 8 on 7th Nov and 9 on 14th. Despite me having an unavoidable commitment on Remembrance Sunday, Stephen Andre, Andy and Kathryn Miller, Michele Lomas, Sean and Samuel Tye all rang for the service. The bells were half muffled = meaning that one 'ding' was quieter than the next on a bell as a solemn token of remembrance. In fact all 8 bells were half muffled, and a band from the Marlborough Branch rang a quarter peal on the 8 bells after lunch.



Avebury Parish Council Meeting Tuesday 7th November.

Major concerns were raised by members of the public attending the meeting about the flooding around Trusloe Manor. The garden has been inundated with foul water as has the footpath that connects the end of Bray Street with Church walk. Thames Water have attended but have not found the source or come up with a solution. The general consensus was that water was backing up in the system and that the pumping station at Big Arch Bridge was overwhelmed. Rainfall recordings this year already outstrip last year's totals with 960mm to date vs 760mm for the whole of last year. Thames Water and Wiltshire Council have been contacted to urge them to come up with a solution as this has been an issue for quite a number of years.

The Council has also received communications from concerned residents in Green Street about the flooding there. Local farmers and Wiltshire Council are working with the National Trust to find a solution.

Local residents are urged to continue reporting local issues such as flooding, overgrown paths, etc. through the MyWilts app or webpage.

Other items included:

- We supported the planning application for improvements to the main car park surfacing and drainage which had been submitted by the National Trust. General manager, Mrs. Jan Tomlin, outlined the work to be done and explained that it will be undertaken in stages to minimise disruption.
- Community Emergency Volunteer Mrs. Judy Farthing, who has filled the role for some years, has resigned and we need a volunteer to co-ordinate the emergency plan and put it into action. For more information please contact Mrs. Maggie Lewis (durranhouse@hotmail.com)
- The missing lamp in the Church yard has been reported several times. It will be followed up again.
- Cllr. Lewis reported that she had met with Mr. James Fry to identify a site for the defibrillator. He is happy for a defibrillator to be sited at Rawlins Park but the two potential sites he identified are not considered suitable by the Ambulance Service.
