Safeguarding, in our Church of England parish of Upper Kennet

On November 12, 2024, Archbishop Justin Welby resigned following the Makin report which revealed significant failures in the Church of England (CoE) regarding abuse disclosures. In the aftermath, diocesan safeguarding teams reported a surge in disclosures of non-recent abuse.

Across all CoE parishes last Sunday (17th November) had already been designated Safeguarding Sunday, aimed at raising awareness about the importance of safeguarding practices within the church. In a letter to clergy and others Bishop Joanne Woolway Grenfell, the CoE's Safeguarding Lead, expressed deep sorrow for the pain endured by abuse victims and emphasized the need for safeguarding to be central to Christian life.

The church has established strong policies and procedures to ensure a safe environment for all individuals, particularly vulnerable groups. To achieve this, each parish has designated safeguarding officers - here Rod Palfrey and Lizzie Daley - who in conjunction with the minister for the parish, serve as initial contacts for concerns, collaborating with Diocesan Safeguarding Advisors to ensure appropriate actions are taken. Confidentiality is weighed against the necessity to protect individuals from potential harm.

Each church has a Safeguarding File outlining principles and policies in a clearly visible position, and notices in the porches that identify individuals and roles (photographs, contact information), and similar information is also on our website. A huge amount of information describing principles, practices and procedures is available on the publicly available websites of our Diocese of Salisbury, and on the CoE website.

The CoE initiated an independent audit of safeguarding practices, with the Diocese of Salisbury being the first to be audited in January 2024. Feedback highlighted the commitment of the community to prioritizing the needs of victims and survivors. The Bishop of Salisbury in a summary of the report outcome reinforced safeguarding as a fundamental right and a Gospel imperative. In another statement he has acknowledged the need for the church to learn from the Makin report and to maintain focus on the experiences of victims and survivors as we all work to improve safeguarding practices.

AVEBURY SOCIAL CENTRE

As many of you will now be aware the NEW HEATING system is now installed! Many thanks to the National Lottery for their funding of this project. While there have been a few hiccups; involving wiring and coin boxes, we can now report that not only is the system working as intended but that heaters have been set at an appropriate temperature for the night and day but also the controls have also been "locked" via a code so that they cannot be messed around with. We appreciate we are still at the learning stage so these may yet have to be adjusted but as I write our Treasurer is investigating the system for remote control of the heaters, so that they could be organised to come on 10 – 15 mins before a booking takes place.

The next stage will be the removal of the old heaters – but as this will then require redecoration of the hall, there may be some delay in this process while funds are arranged.

The Trustees had their quarterly meeting in October where it was agreed that a new software booking system be set up in the near future.

We have also had two successful soup lunches and the musical event Counters Creek which we were very pleased to see so well attended. The Pantomime Robin Hood, already almost sold out, is the next major event to look forward to!

Avebury Tower News

Looking back over the preceding two months, I see that further comment is needed about a "model" (pretty well full sized) bell stood by the remains of the 1636 bell frame on the ground floor of the Church tower. Being difficult to describe what it would look like, the simplest way seemed to install it by the old frame so that it could be seen (it was quite portable). Suffice it to say that it was not seen to be a thing of beauty, and there were thoughts that it could be knocked over and so be a Health and Safety hazard. So it was returned for possible display elsewhere.

An entry in November mentioned the writers hernia operation and his resulting absence from bell ringing and clock winding. After a postponement in September, the operation went ahead on 15th October, and he is now recovering. The problem with hernia operations is that nothing heavy should be lifted, especially if a twist is involved. Winding the clock involves both actions, so thanks to Jonathan Stubbs and Michele Lomas for keeping the clock going in the meanwhile - except we trust residents will forgive a few hours stoppage when the clocks changed from summer to winter time on 27th October. Few if any clock minders want to go and change a mechanical clock's time at 2 o'clock in the morning, the more so since it still needs an hour's stoppage to bring it to the correct time!

Regarding ringing bells after a hernia operation, I have not found any medical people to advise me ringing until the practice on Tuesday 5th November, when he decided it should be safe to ring all the bells except the three heaviest in the tower. Heavier bells should not be heavier to ring provided the ringing is steady - but if things go wrong then trouble could result. Probably the worst thing to do would be to what is called ringing the bells up and down. Sorry to be a bit technical, but readers need to know that wheel-mounted bells (usually) hang upside down when at rest for more than a few minutes, and the act of pulling them to the up position takes quite a few heavy pulls; the more so as the weight of a bell increases. To conclude, I am not ringing any of our bells up until (hopefully) an appointment at the hospital sometime in December results in me being declared back to normal.

Otherwise the past month's practices have continued as usual on Tuesday evenings starting at 7:30 pm. Sadly the Tye twins have now left regular practices to go to University, and they are sadly missed. As ever we are very short of ringers and anybody wishing to ring or learn to ring bells at Avebury has only either to appear at the church at 7:30 on a Tuesday evening, or ring me (Brian Vickers) on 01 672 539 482. If I am not available, then either Helen will take a message, or you can leave one on an answering service. Finally a piece of good news; we had 6 ringers for the Remembrance service on Sunday 10th November so were able to ring both call changes and a plain hunt. Apart from me, the ringers were Andy and Kathryn Miller, Michele Lomas (yes she who later played her trombone for the Last Post), Sean Tye, and last but not least a welcome "occasional" ringer in the person of Stephen Andre

Faith and Charles Lowes

In the beauty and stillness of autumn we interred the ashes of my Aunt and Uncle, Faith and Charles Lowes, who were married at St Michael's and all Angels over 80 years ago. My cousin Rachel began the research for her parent's resting place with Maria, and the service was beautifully carried out by Sibella and the church team. I am proud to say I am at least the 5th generation living in the village and my great uncle is recognised on the war memorial. Faith and Charles met due to the relocation of war and when Charles came out of the army, he, like many others, began a career in teaching, at Stanton and later Atworth.

Faith took well to the role of headmaster's wife and crafted and baked. Charles was musical and artistic and painted the church for Faith. It remained on the wall throughout their married life.

When their son in law died very suddenly and very young, Faith and Charles played an active part in their two Grandson's upbringing, which I think kept them both young at heart.

There was always laughter and fun when my Aunt and Uncle came to visit my Grandparents, Ada and Jack Light in Forge lane. I remember once they were full of a new record release and couldn't wait to share it. Well my Grandparents weren't at all keen, preferring Max Bygraves or Englebert Humperdink. It dates me to say that record was Whiter shade of pale, which Charles later learned to play on the organ.

Social history is so important, do remember to write things down and label photographs, for one day memories may be all that we have.

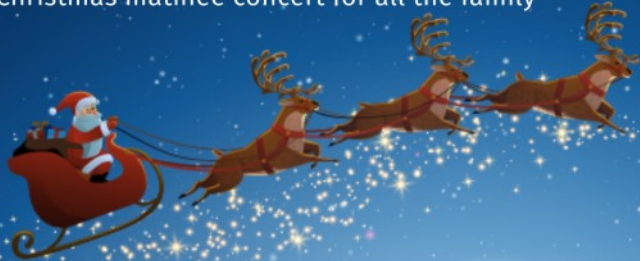

OVER STATE PENSION AGE?

You could be entitled to Pension Credit and get the Winter Fuel Payment

Pension Credit gives people extra money to help with their living costs if they're over State Pension age and on a low income. Pension Credit can also help with housing costs such as ground rent or service charges.

Checking entitlement is easy with the online pension credit calculator: www.gov.uk/pension-credit-calculator

In addition to Pension Credit, those who qualify could also **receive Winter Fuel Payment** and other support like help with housing costs, help with Council Tax and a free TV licence for those aged 75 and over.

Thanks to the Pension Credit backdating rules, it is possible to apply for Pension Credit and have the claim backdated by up to three months, (ticking the backdating box on the claim form). This means that the latest date to apply and still qualify for Winter Fuel Payment is 21 December.

FIRE PRECAUTIONS

Councillor Vacancy

Due to the resignation of Councillor James Northcroft-Brown, there is now a vacancy on Avebury Parish Council (APC), please see the advert for further details.

Flooding

APC's Community Flood Group has been established and is carrying out lots of work behind the scenes to help prevent future flooding in the Parish, including co-ordinating efforts to clear gulleys and culverts, attending flood planning meetings with Wiltshire Council, and working with Action for the River Kennet (ARK).

Play Area Update

The Avebury Trusloe Play Area equipment needs replacing and a survey of parents and children suggested strong support for this. Early discussions with play equipment providers estimate a budget of £35,000 - £45,000 is needed. We would like to set up a Friends of Avebury's Play Area (FAPA) community group to drive the project forward; open to all including parents and businesses. If you have any feedback, ideas, or interest in joining the FAPA please email the Clerk.

Business Forum Launching in Avebury

We are excited to announce the launch of the Avebury Business Forum hosted by APC. The ABF is a new initiative designed to bring together village business representatives to discuss shared concerns, updates, and opportunities for collaboration. We look forward to welcoming representatives from

businesses across Avebury at our inaugural meeting in December and hope the forum will develop into a valuable working group that strengthens our community ties and addresses important issues collectively. The forum will be held quarterly, with agenda items shaped by local business needs and input. We believe this will become an effective platform for collaboration and mutual support within Avebury.

Rights of Way Audit Councillor Natasha Kenyon is now representing APC in the Combined Parish Rights of Way Group. This group aims to address a backlog of issues reported on Wiltshire's Rights of Way. APC has begun an audit of paths within the Parish to identify remaining issues to report back to Wiltshire Council and landowners. We hope to complete this audit by the end of the year.

Litter-ally Working on a Cleaner Avebury APC has received numerous requests to increase the number of litter bins in Avebury, as residents are concerned about litter and dog waste in the village and high-traffic areas. We are currently working with Wiltshire Council and facility management companies on a solution to help reduce litter and keep our beautiful, unique village clean for everyone, we will keep you informed as the project progresses. In the meantime, watch out for further details of our upcoming village litter pick; Valentine for Avebury: Pick up, Clean up, and share the Love for our stunning Village!

Noticeboards Update

We are pleased to announce that new noticeboards will soon be installed in Avebury Trusloe, Beckhampton, and West Kennet. The previous wooden boards, which had unfortunately become irreparable, are being replaced with a modern, maintenance-free alternative. Additionally, the noticeboard on Avebury High Street will be refurbished to ensure it remains in good condition for several more years. Parish Steward Update

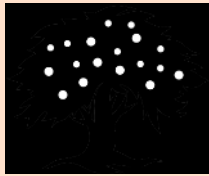
