A View from the Rectory

There are some dates that remain etched in our minds forever: the birth of a child, the death of a loved one, news about a dream job, getting married – and this is true of national and international events. I can still recall where I was the exact moment the Peace Accord was signed in 1997 offering hope to Ireland, and in 1989 when the Berlin wall came down, and the date Nelson Mandela walked free from prison. The date 24th February 2022 will always remain in our memory as a "Day of Infamy". Waking up to the news that thousands of Russian tanks were illegally entering Ukrainian territory was a horror that none of us will forget. A year on, as I write this, I awake to the news once again filled full of the unbelievable suffering of those caught in this violent conflict. However, I also begin to write an update for you on the fundraising appeal for Rev'd Sammy Horner taking medical supplies into Ukraine to the worst afflicted areas. Devastation on one hand and hope in action on the other. It feels sometimes that our drop in the ocean of help and support is useless, the violence, oppression and callousness of war and poverty and injustice outweighing prayers and care for this and other areas of the world suffering terrible things. Not so.

The end of January sees the marking of Holocaust Memorial Day and I am put in mind of the words of Stern: "Whoever saves one life saves the world entire." The quotation supports the theme that one person can make a difference. If even only one person shows humanity to another, this demonstrates the continuing existence of goodness - something utterly void in the actions of those who supress others in word, action or deed.

"Whoever saves one life saves the world entire" reads the Talmudic inscription on a ring given to Oskar Schindler by the people he saved. In Hebrew *Pikuach nefesh* means 'watching over a soul' and is the principle in Jewish law that say 'the preservation of human life overrides virtually any other religious rule'.

Jesus told his followers that He gave them a new commandment - to love one another, and that anyone who offered water, food, shelter, hope, clothing or life to another, or indeed to the least of creation, did as much for him.

When we give to causes, support an appeal or simply offer a few kind words to a stranger we are doing both of these things, transcending barriers imposed by the violent, the cruel and the unjust, and perhaps even saving a single life by doing so, thus saving the entire world.

Maybe when we are called on to give we might see it as 'essential life-saving', and if you are a follower of Jesus, saving Him too. Through each action I pray that our generosity may increase and with it our response to that new commandment: to love one another, stranger and friend.


Lockeridge House – open garden fund raising event for Pancreatic Cancer UK

Avebury Cricket Club 2023 Preview

The club continues to go from strength to strength, with 2022 seeing a massive improvement to our offering to members and their families resulting from the creation of the "Unhenged" coffee shop and café at the Clubhouse. This has dramatically improved our ability to offer something extra to players, families and junior cricketers using the sports field at Avebury, and has been warmly embraced by cricket club members and sports club members alike.

In addition, we have continued to focus on improvements to our grounds equipment and facilities, and on broadening our age group and ability level ranges in the junior section.

Practice Net Facility – Upgrade 2023

We will be embarking on further improvements to our practices facilities in the Winter months in order to be ready for the start of the season in April 2023. These facilities will be funded by members of the club and by public bodies, and will be open to the whole community, and available (subject to a booking system) be used outside of "formal" club training sessions in summer evenings or school holidays.

Junior Cricket

The junior offering at Avebury is bigger than ever. It starts with "All Stars" - a nationally-advertised programme targeting boys and girls aged 5 to 8 years old; "Dynamos" - for boys and girls aged 8 to 11 who still want to focus on softball cricket; Under-9 and Under-10 "Progress to Hardball" - for 8 to 10 year olds wanting to move from softball to hardball cricket; "Under-11s" - our hardball programme (for school years 5 and 6); "Under-13s" (for school years 7 and 8); and "Under-15s" (for school years 9 and 10, including some year 11 girls).

We're also very proud this year to be starting new Girls-only groups at *Under-11* (school years 5 and 6) and *Under-13* (school years 7 and 8) age group levels, making an impressive eight age groups at junior level. In addition, we hope to be running holiday camps in the Easter and Summer holidays, following successful programmes in 2021 and 2022.

Many of the families reading this newsletter will already be involved with the Club and we thank you for everything you do to continue to support us. At the adult level, we are also striving to expand as much as possible and create opportunities for recreational cricket – at weekends, on weekday evenings, and also informal practice and training sessions. In co-operation with White Horse Cricket Club at Broad Hinton, we have agreed to create a THIRD "Saturday" team for 2023, which will play in Division Seven of the Wiltshire League, alongside the 2nd XI in Division 5.

We are particularly hoping that the 3rd XI will be able to support any Dads out their looking to play alongside their children, and also people returning to cricket after a long time, or new entrants to the sport wanting to play in matches.

News from the National Trust

National It's bitterly cold as I'm writing this, but the spring flowers are starting to poke their shoots above the frost, and before we know it, there'll be warm sunshine, daffodils, crocuses, and blossom everywhere.

We're absolutely delighted to be able to say that our Circles Restaurant is at last open fully, and we've been able to expand our range of food – so visitors can enjoy a wider range of delicious snacks, cakes and lunches seven days a week.

Avebury Manor is currently closed for our annual conservation deep clean but will open its doors to the public again on Saturday 11 February. This is also the beginning of February half term, so we'll expect to see a few more families enjoying Avebury, depending on the weather. During this time, we'll be offering an archaeologically themed craft activity for children in the barn, alongside our normal offer.

Finally, we are currently undertaking essential structural repairs to the building that hosts the Post Office; works are expected to continue until mid-February. The area around the Post Office, including a small number of parking spaces and the exit are likely to have to be cordoned off for the duration of the works. However, the car park remains open, with cars having to enter and exit through what is usually the entrance to the car park.

DIGGING UP THEDENE

The Parish Council has received a statutory notice from Thames Water stating its intention to dig up Lockeridge Dene in order to provide a domestic water supply to the disused area of land next to Dene Cottage in Lockeridge. (Please note the land in question is <u>not</u> owned by Dene Cottage). Thames Water have a Statutory Right to lay pipelines on private land.

The Council have responded by refusing permission on the basis there is no house on the land and no planning application has been made for one.

This is not the first time an application has been received and the Council has

repeatedly pointed out to Thames Water that there is a water main in Ryles Lane close to the land and therefore there is no logical reason to dig up the Dene.

Clearly the Parish Council hopes to resolve the matter by agreement but the Council felt it was their duty to make the local residents aware of this difficult situation.

NEW WETLAND AT FYFIELD - UPDATE

The wetland project team is making progress in spite of being hampered by record flood levels. To get an idea of what they are creating you can see a plan on the field gate beside St Nicholas Church Fyfield. When the diggers have finished the planting of trees and wild flowers will begin. The idea is that runoff from the road will pass through the wetland so that cleaner water enters the river Kennet. It will also become a much more bio-diverse environment for wildlife.

Items of discussion from Parish Council Meeting on Wednesday 11th January 2023.

Councillor resignations and co-option

Following the resignation of Councillor Simon Petchey last year, a position was made available for co-option of a resident from Winterbourne Monkton. The vacant position will be filled by Winterbourne Monkton resident Philip Scott who will formally accept the role at the next Parish Council meeting in March.

Councillor George – Perutz, representing Berwick Bassett, has resigned after six years of service to the community. The vacant position is currently being advertised for a resident from Berwick Bassett to join the Parish Council. Budget & Precept for 2023/2024

At the meeting of Wednesday 11th January, the consensus from all councillors was that there should be no increase to the amount that is added to the rate to support the work of the Parish Council. Following review and discussion of the parish council finances, the budget for 2023/2024 was agreed with no increase for householders.

Road surface and vehicle speeds

Councillors Ramsay & Woodward are regularly reviewing comments and complaints received about the poor road surfaces on the A4361 and around the villages and the estimated excessive speeds (greater than 50mph) observed on the A4361. The Parish Council continue to raise concerns, about the road surface, with Wiltshire Council and are once again awaiting repairs to be undertaken. Following written contact with local transport companies about perceived excessive speeds of their vehicles on the A4361, the Parish Council received a mixed response. Vehicle movements and visually interpreted speeds (time to travel between two fixed points) will continue to be monitored.

Reduce speed on village roads in Berwick Bassett and Winterbourne Monkton

The Parish Council hopes to engage with the Local Highway & Footway Improvement Group (LHFIGS) of Wiltshire Council with respect to the installation of traffic counters and classifiers on roads within the two villages. The aim is to show that average speed through the villages is suitable to establish an official speed limit of 20mph on the roads through both villages

Donations

The Parish Council agreed to make donations to several local and county organisations, one of which was Wiltshire Air Ambulance, which had been in attendance at two road traffic accidents in the previous year.
