New Beginnings

I moved into the rectory in Avebury on 6th January which is the church feast day of Epiphany. On this day the church celebrates the coming of the magi, wise men who read the heavens and followed a star which took them to the new born Christ child. They came bearing meaningful gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh which were specific gifts for this child. Gold for a king, frankincense for a god and myrrh for death and rites of passage.

When I moved into the house, many people knocked on the door and gave me meaningful gifts too, including a hamper full of local produce and other goodies to make me feel welcome and valued. Things to link me with the local land and what happens in the community. It was a beautiful offering of welcome and of warmth and of acceptance. I was and am very grateful for this. Mary must have felt that too with the gifts from the shepherds and the magi, people visiting with gifts that showed they understood in a heartfelt way.

The local produce I received was particularly welcome. There is something special about where one lives. When moving into a community it is important that one is welcomed by those who live there in order to start to settle in. When we live somewhere a long time we shape the landscape and we are also shaped by it. If we live in one place for most of our lives our physical bodies become part of the physicality of that place. And our ancestors call to us through the landscape that they helped to shape though their lives of long ago. There is a romanticism to this but there is also a poetic Romanticism which evokes a spiritual reality.

'To see a World in a Grain of Sand,
 And a Heaven in a Wild Flower;
 Hold Infinity in the palm of your hand,
 And Eternity in an hour.'

Heaven is near. But it is not monochrome. It is expressed through the uniqueness of each place. Like each of us every place and every moment has its distinct beauty. And I feel very privileged to be sharing the beauty of this place with you and look forward to sharing with you the challenges and joys to come that rise to meet us over the horizon.

December 2024

Fourteen members enjoyed an excellent Christmas lunch at the White Horse in Compton Bassett. The winner of the competitions was announced, well done Muriel, and the prize and cup presented. Christmas cards and Secret Santa gifts were exchanged and a very social occasion was enjoyed by all.

November 2024

At our November meeting we welcomed George Dellar, local resident and Community First Responder (CFR). CFRs are part of the Ambulance Service and are called to attend as a first line of treatment before the emergency ambulance can arrive although they are not sent to road traffic accidents or situations where they might be in danger. George attends Level 1 cases – the most serious such as heart attacks and strokes – but CFRs can choose to attend any level of case.

George has been a CFR for 15 years and covers an area within 3 miles of his home although he is often called further afield. He brought his kit bag to explain what he takes to a call – oxygen, dressings, blood pressure monitor, etc. – and what he does when he arrives at the patient, taking observations (pulse, BP, respiratory rate) as well as administering some medication. He demonstrated the defibrillator - a life saving piece of kit in the event of a heart attack. Avebury has 3 and Winterbourne Monkton 5 of these machines. He also told us about the initial and ongoing training CFRs receive, ensuring they are equipped to cope with whatever they come across on a call. He goes out regularly on shift with an emergency ambulance crew to understand their role and learn from them. Anyone can train to become a CFR and more information about the role and how to apply can be found on the SWAST website (<https://www.swast.nhs.uk/community-first-responders/>)

Supplier Profile – Brinkworth Dairy Cheese



I thought that it might be interesting for our readers to hear about one of our suppliers this month.

Some of our cheeses are supplied by Brinkworth Dairy which is a family farm established in 1910 when William Collingborn established a pedigree Friesian herd.

The cows graze on the traditional lush pastures of the Dauntsey Vale in North Wiltshire for 240 days of the year. The herd is relatively small which means the cows are not stressed. Ceri is the fifth generation of the family to have made cheese on the farm. Starting in 2005 she revived the Wiltshire Loaf which went on to win Best Territorial Cheese at the British Cheese Awards. The Wiltshire Loaf was recorded by Jane Austen in her book Emma. At Avebury Community Shop we currently have in stock:-

Royal Bassett Blue - Blue rind and a creamy centre. Named after Royal Wootton Bassett in the jubilee year.
Wiltshire Loaf - The traditional North Wiltshire cheese that Ceri's Great Grandfather used to make. Unique, hard, creamy, crumbly, medium strength, sweet and sharp. Matured for 2 -5 months.

Gallipot Eyes - This cheese is based on a Gouda recipe and is matured for 6 months to 18 months. The name comes from writings by John Aubrey on North Wiltshiremen in 1656.

Ramps Hill - An alpine style cheese, It is named after Brinkworth's equivalent of Mount Blanc Ramps Hill! It is sweet and nutty.

Avebury - A soft white cheese with a buttery texture. Oozy, soft at the edges with a smooth centre and soft springy body.

Avebury Tower News

The Christmas / New Year season and now Jonathan Poston's Induction / Licensing service are busy for many of us, and bellringing at Avebury has been no exception. Your correspondent feared that ringers might be few in number with the winter weather and general busyness, but happily things were better in most event(s). We started well with our usual Tuesday evening practice on 17th Dec when there were 8 ringers for our usual 6 bells. Next was the Carol Service on Sunday 22nd when only 4 of us rang, but as I have previously written, 4 ringing bells changing their order of striking probably (well hopefully) sounds fairly normal for non-ringers. Happily for the Crib Service ring on Christmas Eve the two Tye twins (James and Samuel) had returned from their courses at Southampton University, so with dad Sean we had 3 Tye's to start with. Adding Andy and Kathryn Miller, Michele Lomas and Brian Vickers we had 7 ringers for the 6 bells (and Amanda Tye as a non ringing supporter!).

The next ring was for the New Year when we had the 6 ringers shown in the photo below. From left to right they are Adam Lomas, Brian Vickers, Sean Tye, Kathryn Miller, Andy Miller and Michele Lomas. On a few such occasions we have come down from the tower to be greeted by quite a large party of celebrants, but this year the poor weather meant that the last ones were leaving as the first ringers descended. One change hopefully not noticed by the (mainly absent) public was that instead of ringing with the bells muffled on every other stroke to mark the sad passing of the old year and then with the muffles removed to joyfully greet the start of the new year, failing health prevented the necessarily quick removal of the muffles just before



midnight. Instead we hopefully marked the end of 2024 by ringing much slower than usual, and joyfully greeted 2025 by ringing much quicker.

The latest ring to report is that for the Induction Service on the evening of 16th Jan. Since it brought together the seven constituent Churches of the Benefice / Parish of Upper Kennet, we decided we ought to reflect this by inviting ringers from the other two towers currently ringing to ring at Avebury. Apart from the usual ringers reported on above, we were pleased to welcome Mark Sadler from Broad Hinton and Richard Matters from West Overton. We kept our ringing simple to avoid any too-obvious clashes and silences, but as a result of having two more good ringers, we were able to have all our 8 bells in action to call mindful residents to Church before the service.

DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING, SATURDAY 24TH MAY 2025, KENNET VALLEY HALL

Our annual defibrillator and CPR training session will be held at Kennet Valley Hall from 10am – midday on Saturday 24th May 2025.

We have four defibrillators in the Kennet Valley Parish:

- St Nicholas Church porch, Lower Fyfield, SN8 1PP
- The Who'd A Thought It public house porch, Lockeridge, SN8 4EL
- Kennet Valley Hall porch, SN8 4EL
- The disused phone box near the bus stop in West Overton, SN8 4ER

Knowing how to use the defibrillators could save a life. Parishioners are invited to attend including those who have been to a previous session and want to refresh your knowledge.

TREE AND HEDGE CUTTING ADVICE

Firstly, thank you to residents for keeping hedges cut back to keep pathways etc clear. We hope the following information will be helpful as thoughts perhaps now turn toward Spring and getting back out in the garden

HEDGES

- Hedge cutting is prohibited from 1st March to 31 August to protect nesting birds and wildlife habitats. It's essential to check for signs of nesting birds before cutting. Exceptions exist for specific activities, such as agricultural support, and certain tree species, but permits may be required.
- Evergreen hedges can be cut at any time of year, but deciduous hedges should only be trimmed during the growing season, generally considered from April to September
- You are legally entitled to trim back hedges or branches of overgrown trees or hedges if they fall into your property from a neighbour's property or public area. You are only legally entitled to trim up to the property boundary and no further.
- Cutting any hedge from the 1 March to the 31 August may lead to penalties unless the operation is required for the health and safety of road users. If the hedges are not causing an obstruction to movement or view then they should not be cut in the closed period

TREES

- Before carrying out any tree work you must check if a tree is covered by a Tree Preservation Order (TPO), Conservation Area, or through another form of protection. All three of our

villages lie within an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and Lockeridge is in a Conservation Area.

- You may have already been notified that a TPO covers trees that you own, either when the order was originally served or through a Local Land Charges search carried out by your solicitor prior to you purchasing your property. Wiltshire Council's website also has a helpful search tool to ascertain if a tree is covered by a TPO or is in a conservation area or you can contact the Planning department.

CAR SECURITY DURING THE COLD WEATHER

Devizes Police reported that an unattended car was stolen from a driveway whilst it was de-icing and warming up. The car was later located by Devizes Police. Whilst it is essential and a legal requirement to make sure all car windows are clear from any obstructions before you drive, please be careful about leaving the car unattended with the engine running - you will not be insured if it is stolen.

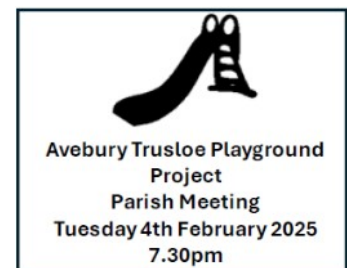
