### **MEDITATION (TAIZÉ) Service**

Every fortnight on a Wednesday evening at East Kennett Church from 7.00 to 7.25pm: a chance to just sit quietly and relax and enjoy the silence and the peace by candlelight, with a background of occasional singing and some words of wisdom.

Future dates for your diary: Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> January, Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> January, Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> February. Last January I wrote about overhearing a woman declare her longing to have 20:20 vision and predict the year ahead – well, I wonder what she might be thinking now a year on. 'No one expects the Spanish Inquisition' the Monty Python sketch says, and I feel the same could be said about the pandemic. It is still in full swing, folks, but vaccination offers the world hope. Perhaps as we end this strange year we might take stock of what we want to forget and want we want to hold onto and foster more. Last year I wrote the following words and they have been seen in action in our community in a way we could never have imagined.

'If each of us chooses to undertake one small act to make the world a better place in 2020 our droplets of love would become a flood that brings transformation, not destruction... And to make the difference we can where we can in whatever way we can 'In Our Living Years'. And... our local communities found ways of supporting the vulnerable, encouraging the lonely and enabling our local business to keep going. The work of the Covid groups, the unity of purpose between sectors of the community, voluntary groups, parish councils, churches and others and the increased awareness of our neighbours is something that cannot be undone. We have been changed as we have been challenged and we know we are better together, and apart. We have, I believe, become aware of what really matters and for the most part there has been a generosity of spirit and openness to being flexible, and a genuine joy in the 'small wins' that enabled us to come together safely for Remembrance, for VE day, for a market or two, for worship, in small groups outside the pub, sharing laughter together (loudly) at a distance of 2 metres or more.

And what is it that matters? Being together, being unafraid together, being able to communicate in all ways with each other without distance. Having the freedom we took for granted to get together on a whim. The rediscovery of the countryside around us - 'I've lived here 7 years and this is the first time I have walked the Ridgeway' – and the realisation of how lucky we are to have it when others are cramped in high-rise flats. That we have a choice when 'this is all over' NOT to return to the way it was but to press a reset button and make the things that matter our priority so:

That those we care about know we love them and we say it and show it now

That our communities keep growing in mutual care and respect and welcome

That what we have learned about home working and business working changes and shapes how we use our resources

That the socio-economic gap between north and south is addressed

That our young people whose education was interrupted are seen and valued for their courage and resilience and adaptability more than the grade they get

And that our environment truly becomes a priority and focus that all may share in its bounty and protect its creatures.

Can the 20:20 vision of last year become a 20:21 reality because of our experiences together in the Pandemic?

Ohhh - I would like to have 20:21 vision... and I am praying that together we can 'Make it so'.

### Avebury Parish Council Headlines from Avebury Parish Council's

Headlines from Avebury Parish Council's on-line meetings on 1 December 2020 and Planning Committee meeting on 9

December 2020

Road safety: We decided to support the proposal to reduce the speed limit from 60mph to 50mph on the A4361 between Beckhampton and Avebury as long as the limit north of the village is also reduced. In parallel a petition available in local shops and online at http://

aveburyparishcouncil.org/ asks Wiltshire Council to bring the limit down to 40mph. Please sign it!

**High Street:** Two additional litter bins have been installed, one in the High Street car park and the other amongst the planters.

Planning applications: We supported applications for work to a sycamore tree at Gunsite Lane, to replace windows and doors at the Henge Shop, and to build a garage and lower a ridge height at Sarsen Kennels (these last being adjustments to an application previously supported).

National Trust update: We heard that the Trust's operations are returning to their prelockdown state although the manor, its garden, the great barn, and the chapel remain closed. The Keiller Museum is due to open in January. We noted that celebration of the winter solstice on 21 December is expected to be low key.

Play area: Adopting a phased approach, we decided to start work on improving the play area by installing at least one piece of equipment in the New Year.

Beckhampton: We have received a request for a handrail alongside steps leading into the village from the lay-by opposite the Waggon and Horses and decided that, whilst we wanted to help, ownership should be confirmed before further action taken. A replacement mirror and post have been ordered to help drivers negotiating the sharp bend at the west end of the village.

**Handyman:** We agreed to post an advert in this publication for the services of one or more handypersons.

Budget: We agreed to increase the precept by £413 in order to allow us to maintain our reserves and to complete local projects. The approximate annual increase for the owner of a mid-rated property is expected to be £1.53.

Date of next meeting: 2 February 2021 at 19h30. Residents wishing to participate in this meeting are most welcome to do so. Draft minutes of this meeting may be found on the Avebury Parish Council website.

### **News from the Tower**

I have recently been re-reading a book by Richard Jefferies, a nature writer, who was born on a farm near Coate Water, Swindon, in 1848. His description of entering a church tower climbing the winding stone staircase, the confined space, the arrow slits being choked with cobwebs, the fluttering of Jackdaws in the belfry and the tick of the clock, would sound familiar to most ringers today.

He describes the ringers as 'an independent body, rustic though they may be'! He also suggests that 'when the bells are ringing at Christmas time, go outside, for it is a noble music, remember also that it is music that has echoed from the hills for hundreds and hundreds of years. Rude men as they are, these bell ringers gratefully respond to the least appreciation of their art'. Today, the arrow slits are glazed but are still full of cobwebs; many women ring, and only a few of us are rustics and proud to be! We also like to be appreciated, and it is always lovely to see people from the village waiting near the lychgate, having listened to the New Year being rung in.

We look forward to being able to carry on this ancient tradition again when the pandemic is over.


