#### A View from a Mental Health Chaplain

The cold, dark and gloomy days with the stark stripping back of nature can make us feel exposed and adrift in the stillness of it all. We may long for the lighter and warmer days of Spring. It is in such times that we can find solace and wisdom in nature. Winter teaches us about the beauty of rest, shedding old layers, and embracing renewal. So, as the Earth rests during winter, cannot we?

As this New Year begins, I gently encourage you to grant yourself the gift of stillness. The Psalms remind us, "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10). 

#### **Avebury Parish Council**

<u>Public question time:</u> Following a resident's request, we said we would seek reductions as soon as possible in the height of the trees on the south side of Rawlins Park.

**Flooding:** Noting that there would soon be two vacancies on our emergencies and flood prevention committee, we agreed to invite residents keen to help the community in this way to make themselves known to Maggie Lewis (durranhouse@hotmail.co.uk). Really important work – as recent events have shown!

<u>**B4003**</u>: We said we would repeat our request to Wiltshire Council to ask for action – urgently - to prevent further destruction of the verge adjacent to the recently remodelled layby.

<u>Defibrillator</u>: We heard that South West Ambulance Service Foundation Trust had expressed reservations about the locations proposed for a defibrillator at Rawlins Park and agreed to confirm and seek approval for two others.

<u>Planning:</u> Whilst reminding the PCC of APC's tree policy encouraging would-be tree fellers to plant an equal number of new trees, we supported an application from the PCC to remove three trees behind the church. We also supported a minor variation and additional detail in an approved application from Manor Farm, Bray Street and urged Wiltshire Council to expedite the approval process.

<u>Leaves:</u> We agreed to ask the parish steward to sweep leaves, especially from the footpaths between Bray Street and the village and its connection towards Chapel Corner, and elsewhere where needed.

<u>Date and place of next meeting</u>: 6 February at 19h30 in the Social Centre. As always, residents wishing to participate in these meetings are most welcome to do so.



#### **News from the National Trust**

- January 2024

#### A busy time in the Manor Garden

We have started two projects in the Manor Garden, to restore the iconic Lavender Walk and the Topiary Garden. Following removal of some old plants, the process of planting thousands of bulbs has begun, starting with snowdrops and winter iris in the Lavender Walk. Narcissus triandrius 'Thalia', a multi-headed and scented daffodil, is being planted in the Topiary Garden, which also now features the first tranche of Taxus (Yew). Head Gardener Garry Mumford said: "The Taxus will now be left alone to allow the roots to establish. We will trim them in early to mid-spring and they will begin to take the lattice-shape, one of the iconic aspects of the gardens here at Avebury."

#### Limited car parking between 2-12 January

There will be limited parking for visitors between 2-12 January 2024, due to essential works being undertaken ahead of anticipated improvements in February. We have been informing visitors through the website and are promoting the use of available public transport routes.

#### Caring for the monument

Like last year, we are giving all four henge banks in the monument a chance to recover from festive season footfall. Access to the banks will be closed during January, but the rest of the monument will be accessible as usual.

#### Thank you for your support this Christmas

Avebury Manor will be closed between 2-12 January to allow our Christmas display to be removed and carry out essential conservation cleaning, but we hope to see you again after that. As always, residents of Avebury, including Avebury Trusloe, Rawlins Park, Beckhampton and West Kennett get free entry to the manor, garden and museum by simply showing proof of address on arrival.
