A View from the Rectory

Have you ever been stuck for words? This week when a little reminder about deadlines for the *View from the Rectory* dropped into my 'in' box from the Benefice Office I found myself staring at the screen. I got up and went walk-about - that usually helps. Wandered down the back garden to the area we use for 'Space to Breathe' and sorted the seats (bird poo!) and the firepit ready for tonight's prayer and ... silence. Nothing. Not a spark. Even the birds were still and quiet under the weight of the hot sun, and the breeze that stirred occasionally merely moved the humid air around and brought no relief.

I left it a while and people came with their sorrows and troubles, questions without answers, the business of a busy parish, hopes and dreams for the future. And while the words came in an ebb and flow between us, I struggled afterwards to find a theme, a strand to pick up and run with for you, the readers of the Rector's ramblings, month in, month out.

Then the phone rang and I found I had no words to offer I sat and listened to the sobs and the hurt unable to offer anything except 'I am here', 'I am listening' and I think I even said 'I have no word; there are no words; it is simply dreadful and my heart is broken for you'.

So I have no words in this *View from*, except to say there are times we have no words and that is fine. Maybe the words we speak (or write) don't matter in the grand scheme of things. Maybe it is the gift of feeling the sorrow, sitting with the sorrowful, and saying everything in the sitting and nothing with the tongue. This is, I believe, the way of God (the divine, the presence, - whatever word you use to describe that inexpressible something that is just THERE). In the song without words of a God sitting alongside us all I feel we may find more than words can express. In the listening of a friend, the touch of a hand, the hug that holds the collapse of another, God touches us too, and there is no need for words.

An old hymn I sang when I was in my teens puts it this way:

'Every day, every hour, every moment, Have been blessed by the strength of God's love. At the turn of each tide God is there at my side, With a touch that is gentle as silence.'



Practices have continued as usual on Tuesday evenings from 7.30pm until 9pm. They have generally been well supported, but newcomers are always welcome. Don't forget that a 'tester' session is to be held at West Overton on 8th July to offer a chance to see what change ringing is all about on the bells there. In the past years Avebury ringers have rung for weddings at Broad Hinton, Calne, Compton Bassett, Lyneham and others as well as West Overton; and they, of course, helped us when we were short of ringers.

On Saturday, 3rd June, Michele and Adam Lomas, Kathryn Miller, Sean Tye and Brian Vickers rang to mark the start of the commemoration party held in the Social Centre to mark the memory of the late Heather Peak – Garland. The event was much delayed by the Covid problem, but thanks to Heather's nephew Tim it eventually happened. Heather and her sister Jane were instrumental in getting a new ring of bells installed in the Avebury tower in 1980 after many years of silence following World War Two. The old wooden frame was declared unsafe. Parts of it dating from the 1630s can still be seen in the ground floor of the tower. Heather and Jane then rang regularly for many years. Both of the sisters are still very much missed.

A Summer of Stukeley

At this time of year, we're getting ready for the summer holidays and looking for ways to keep visitors with families engaged with Avebury and its history.

To celebrate 300 years since antiquarian William Stukeley created some of his incredible drawings at Avebury, the theme this summer will be 'Summer of Stukeley' and we will be weaving different aspects of this into our family offer.

From the end of June there is an exhibition of drawings by Stukeley

on display in the barn, some of them accompanied by images of the same scenes taken today – do pop along and have a look. From 26 July a Stukeley display and a children's trail will keep families busy in the Alexander Keiller Museum, accompanied by a family trail booklet around the whole site

The Parish Council is continuing to focus on a range of issues across the Parish reflecting parishioners' concerns.

Traffic

Following the fatal road accident on the A4 on 29th May 2023 the Parish Council is renewing its efforts to improve road safety in our area.

We are working in partnership with our neighbouring Parish Councils: the 'West of Marlborough Traffic Group' to consider a range of road safety issues including speed, road design and signage

Lockeridge Community Speedwatch Team

The Lockeridge Community Speedwatch Team has continued its patrols and have been supported recently by the Wiltshire Police Speed Enforcement Officers. More volunteers would enable the Team to patrol more frequently. If you can spare some time please contact Clerk@kvparishcouncil.org.uk. Thank

you – less speeding makes our roads safer.

Report from the latest Police speed enforcement session in Lockeridge.

Nine vehicles were issued with notices of intended prosecution for excessive speeding.

The fastest vehicle was captured at **32** MPH. 12 miles faster than the village speed limit!

Depending on previous convictions and history,

• 8 drivers will be offered a speed awareness course, 1 driver will be given £100 fine and receive 3 penalty points.

Vehicles will also be checked for MOT & Insurance, plus the captured footage will be analysed for other offences like seat belts and mobile phone use.

Police will continue to carry out speed checks in the village in addition to our regular volunteer Speedwatch sessions.

If a car travelling at 35 mph hits a pedestrian there is a 50% chance they will be killed.

At **30mph** it is **20%** chance they will be killed.

At **20 mph** there is a **2.5%** chance they will be killed.

Our village roads are shared with Pedestrians including children walking to School, horse riders, horse drawn carriages and cyclists.

Please do not exceed the speed limit and remind any guests/tradesmen who may drive through our village to reach your

property to obey the limit as well.

Defibrillator training

Our annual defibrillator and first aid training session was held at Kennet Valley Hall on Sunday 11th June 2023. Local residents were informed about basis first aid techniques and how to use the defibrillators.

St Michael and All Angels Church West Overton FLOWERS

We believe that there are people out there who would enjoy making the Church beautiful with flowers.

We believe there is someone who could take on the setting up of a rota such as we used to have.

Ideally we need a willing soul or two to take on each month, apart from Advent before Christmas and Lent, usually February to Easter, when no flowers are required. Each month has two services, the second and fourth Sundays. News from the Marlborough Deanery link with the Diocese of Morobo

The partnership between the Marlborough Deanery and the Diocese of Morobo in South Sudan is progressing well. The planting of seeds to provide sustenance for the clergy was hampered initially by lack of rain and then by termites devouring the crops, but the rains came and we were able to send money for pesticides, which have dealt with the termites, so planting continues.

Our second project was to equip the clergy with Bibles. The Lent Appeal across our Deanery proved to be very successful, with £4,248 raised. This will provide Bibles both in English and in local languages, enabling the clergy to teach and preach the word of God with confidence. In addition there will be enough money to purchase covers for the Bibles and some liturgy books and hymn books. We were only hoping to raise £2000, so thank you to everybody who donated so generously.

Leaflets, with photographs, giving more details about the partnership and suggesting topics for prayer should be available in churches. While South Sudan is showing signs of greater stability, the events in the North will inevitably have an impact. Already over 1000 refugees from the North have reached Morobo, to add to the number of returnees from refugee camps in Uganda.

Thank you to everybody who donated money to provide the clergy of Morobo Diocese in South Sudan with their own Bible, either in English or their local language. We were looking for our Deanery to raise about £2000, but in the end raised £4248, so have been able to provide money for Bible covers, liturgical books and hymn books as well. Thank you for your generosity.
