Hot July brings cooling showers, Apricots and gillyflowers...

The Months – Sara Coleridge

As I sit writing this in the melting heat of Summer Solstice, some cooling showers would be most welcome. We have certainly had a summer this year!

We now roll towards the end of the school year, a sense of culmination of work done and school children and teachers coming together to celebrate achievements, before scattering to be with families for holidays and breaks, and before gathering together again in the Autumn.

This pattern of all coming together at high season reminds me of the Feast of Pentecost that we recently celebrated. The disciples had followed Jesus for three years, learning and making notes, and they were about to graduate with a spectacular, drop-the-mike graduation event. They were all gathered together waiting for the coming of the Holy Spirit which arrived like a great gale of wind and, instead of mortar boards, tongues of flame landed on each disciple's head. They each became empowered for their life's task and went out far and wide preaching the new message of love and redemption – it was quite the summer project they were given!

My current obsession is reading a lot of Arthurian literature (in between books on Celtic Saints) as it seems to hold a key for the interweaving of pagan and Christian themes. Arthur and his Knights, mirroring the disciples, meet every Pentecost. It is recognised as a time of empowerment.

Pentecost was a time when King Arthur hosted a great and grand feast for his lords and ladies with his Knights at the Round Table. It was customary for Arthur to wait for a marvel to occur before beginning the feast, which usually involved someone entering with news of a strange or wonderful event, or a quest, or challenge. The ultimate one was the call to the quest of the Holy Grail that I talked about at our Solstice event. That quest was a bit of a leap for Arthur's Knights. Definitely the end of primary teaching and moving on to the school of big life lessons.

I wonder how many of you out there are completing something, having a summer break and then starting something new and big in September? Two of my colleagues hope to, as they look towards starting ordination training in September. Theirs really will be a Quest for the Holy Grail.

Whether the summer you plan will be a holy quest, a pilgrimage, a time of recuperation, or you will have the challenge of dragons to conquer or subdue, may God go with you and the Spirit guide you.

Hot and Dry Wildfire Risks

If British Summer Time and warmer days mean you will be visiting one of Dorset and Wiltshire's local heathlands or outdoors spaces to enjoy the wildlife and wilderness, please take a picnic.

Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service (DWFRS) is encouraging residents and visitors to bring a picnic and not a barbecue when out and about. Warmer and breezy weather increases the risk of accidental or deliberate fires in our open spaces.

A wildfire can move at speeds faster than an Olympic sprinter, so we are asking everyone to follow some simple steps:

If you are enjoying our open spaces when a fire occurs, get to a safe place and call the fire service on 999 immediately, with as much information as possible.

Consider downloading and using What3Words to identify your exact location.

You can also help by reporting any anti-social behaviour on our heaths and open spaces to the Police on 101.

Landowners and land managers are also advised, where possible, to be prepared for fires and ensure that fire breaks are cut and well maintained with any cut grasses and vegetation removed from the site.

KENNET VALLEY ANNUAL DEFIBRILLATOR AND CPR TRAINING SESSION

The annual defibrillator and Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) session was held on Saturday 24th May 2025 at Kennet Valley Hall. The training is provided by the South West Ambulance NHS Trust as part of the contract arranged by the Parish Council including the four defibrillators which are sited across the Parish at:

- Fyfield; St. Nicholas Church porch
- Kennet Valley Hall – in the front porch
- Lockeridge – in the front porch of the 'Who'da Thought It' pub.
- West Overton – the GPO telephone box next to the bus shelter

Almost twenty people attended the session which comprised a mix of theory and practical learning with use of a mannequin. The attendees found the session very helpful and feedback included the following:

This training is an annual event so look out for a date for next year's session. Knowing how to use the defibrillators could save a life!

MYWILTS

MyWilts is a free app that lets you book services and report issues to Wiltshire Council simply, quickly and easily. The services available include reporting road and street issues, fraud and trading standards in our local area. You can attach documents, photos or videos to provide additional information and pinpoint exact locations using the mapping software on your device.

When you submit your case, it goes to the relevant Wiltshire Council team for actioning. Cases may be submitted anonymously for most services. However, this means you will not receive any updates on the progress of your case. If you register as a user, you will be able to view updates as the case progresses.

Issues which can be reported:

- Abandoned vehicles
- Dog Fouling
- Dead animals on the road
- Fly Tipping
- Graffiti
- Faulty Streetlights
- Roads, pavements and highways
- Public litter bins
- Street litter/sweeping

Welcome to our two new Parish

Bin project progress 🗑️

Over recent months, we have been working to improve the availability and placement of public bins across the parish.

Two new bins have now been installed; one at the corner of the Red Lion car park, opposite Elements of Avebury, helping tackle the issue of discarded poo bags near Green Street, the Cove, and surrounding paths. The other, near the benches at Big Arch, a popular resting point where more bin capacity was much needed. Looking ahead, a third new bin for Green Street is now being incorporated into the wider project aimed at tackling illegal parking in the area.

Drainage cleared on Church Walk

We're pleased to report that Wiltshire Council has completed the clearance of the drains along Church Walk. This essential maintenance will help improve drainage in the area and reduce surface water during

wet weather.

New website

Road safety

A reduced LHFIFG budget has put a delay on the two speed reduction initiatives submitted by APC. We have therefore voted to fund the full cost of the speed survey for Avebury Trusloe and are actively working with neighbouring Parish Councils to fund the survey required on the A4 Overton Hill to West Kennet.

Meet your Councillors

Each month, we'll be spotlighting one of your Parish Councillors so you can get to know the people representing our community a little better.

First up is our Chair, Mike Bedford. Mike first joined the Parish Council to help improve road safety in Beckhampton by addressing traffic speed and has continued to serve the wider parish ever since.

Now Chair, he brings a long-standing commitment to preserving the landscape and supporting community wellbeing. Passionate about nature, Mike often picks litter while out walking or cycling, doing

his bit to care for the place he's called home for 23 years.

News from the National Trust July

'Avebury as home' oral history project

As repairs continue to progress in Avebury Manor, we are launching a new project that will hopefully form an important part of its future presentation.

From 12th Century monks to 20th Century residents, the site of Avebury Manor has witnessed centuries of change and has been a home to many. We want to add to that story by collecting your experiences, thoughts, and memories of what makes Avebury more than just a historic site, but a home.

We'll be hosting a day of interviews on Wednesday 10 September, from 11am to 7pm, with each session lasting around 30 minutes. If that date doesn't work for you, we'll do our best to arrange another time.

Exploring Avebury through digital games

A series of digital games, curated and developed by the Universities of Southampton and Bournemouth in collaboration with the National Trust, will launch at Avebury later this month.

The games will be available to download and play from Friday 25 July, with a preview being held on Thursday 24 July. On both these days, as well as Saturday 26 July, professors and designers from both universities will be in the barn talking to visitors.

It would be lovely to see members of the local community on any of these days and if you do try one of the games over the summer, we'd love to get your feedback.

The games have been developed as part of LoGaCulture, a research project funded by Horizon Europe which brings together experts, cultural sites, and academic institutions across the continent. To find out more about the project visit www.logaculture.eu.

Avebury Manor Garden rated 'Excellent'

Tuesday 10 June was a big day for staff and volunteers in Avebury Manor Garden – inspection day! Every year, the garden gets reviewed by a regional expert from the National Trust and we're delighted to share that it received an 'excellent' rating. It's the highest possible rating the Trust gives, and the first time Avebury has received the top mark. It's a testament to the hard work Head Gardener Garry and his team have put in over the last two years.

In that time, they've moved towards organic practices, developed a new sensory woodland walk,

and introduced dozens of new plants in the Lavender Walk, East Garden, Topiary Garden and Monks' Garden.

Residents of Avebury parish get free entry to Avebury Manor Garden by showing proof of address. If you haven't visited for a while, we'd recommend a return this summer.

Help to build a bug hotel

From pollinators to pest controllers, bugs and insects play a vital role in Avebury Manor Garden. To recognise their efforts, we're planning to build them a new home and we'd like your help.
