View from the Rectory

As I write this mid-May we have just had news of the destruction of the home of yet another family of the Lighthouse School in Gaza; moment by moment news filters through of children injured, homes rattling under bombardment, power lines destroyed, smashed water pipes beneath roads and human waste spilling out of the ground. Many of you have emailed or spoken to me knowing my connection with the school for over 14 years and some of you have asked for an update

The statistics are staggering: 188 plus killed, many of them women and children, families trapped under rubble, and fears mounting of a deepening humanitarian crisis in a prison where two million people live under an Israeli -Egyptian blockade which has been in place for 14 years. To date six of Gaza's 10 electricity lines are down and repair crews are unable to fix the lines due to continued attacks. Israel has blocked access to the territory for all aid workers and prevented fuel from entering. A spokesperson from the UN confirmed supplies of vital animal feed remain festering in trucks held on the Israeli side of the frontier, adding the chilling fact that Gaza's stockpiles of food and feed would run out on Pentecost, Sunday 25th May. UN humanitarian coordinator Lynn Hastings appealed to the Israeli authorities and Palestinian armed groups to immediately allow the United Nations and our humanitarian partners to bring in fuel, food, and medical supplies. More than 17,000 people have fled their homes and are sheltering in roughly 40 schools. All this in a pandemic.

Many of my contacts in the Jewish community around the world have pleaded for a ceasefire (www.jewishvoiceforpeace.org). There is

widespread concern amongst aid agencies that current violent exchanges will lead to further human rights violations, poverty and suffering, particularly for a lost generation of children and young Palestinians. Laila Barhoum, a charity's adviser in Gaza, as reported in the Guardian newspaper said: "Day after day we watch the bombs fall on homes where our friends and family live and buildings where our colleagues work, wondering if we will be next. And day after day we wait in vain for the unequivocal condemnation from the international community that never comes". And yet, the resilience and hope of this battered community, caught in the maelstrom of ancient hatreds and reactions to persecutions between two warring factions, is astounding. Leila adds "When a ceasefire is eventually declared, we will once again dig out from the rubble and begin to rebuild, only to wait for another cycle of bombardment to destroy what we have done". And they will, God willing, and I will be there with others from the Hope Christian Trust to help.

I remember on my second visit to the Gaza strip seeing the power of the human spirit revealed in flowers, deliberately planted (hibiscus) between bombed out houses and along the sides of the potholed roads, and children physically hungry, mentally and emotionally traumatised, for whom the Love of God and the Lighthouse School meant everything in a world of uncertainty, violence and fear. There was a deep and profound sense that the school, underpinned by God's welcome and love, would survive anything, including a pandemic and this latest round of violence. The innocents on both sides suffer and most of all the children of Gaza and I for one cannot ignore their plight.

On June 10th at 730pm we shall gather for a special Gaza update evening in the Rectory garden and we shall be joined by Rev'd John and Mrs Janet Angle of the Hope Christian Trust for a conversation, and for prayer and fellowship. The event will be streamed on Zoom so those still isolating can join in. As I write the Avebury PCC are looking at a date for a fundraiser Teas for Tourists in aid of the school, so watch this space. Above all, whatever your faith, whatever you may feel about the political wrongs and rights of the Middle East in conflict, please pray that for the sake of the children the spirit of love and peace may extinguish the flames of hate and

As I forgot to submit an update for April I'm including it here. Our AGM was held and all the current committee, being happy to continue, were re-elected as there was no great rush to replace us — we must be doing something right! Our speaker was Angela White who took us on a journey from Exeter all the way to Sorrento to meet friends from abroad. She and her husband did the whole trip by train encountering a few alarms and excursions on the way and learning about the vagaries of different countries train services. They arrived safely in Sorrento and enjoyed their stay before heading back, via a slightly different route to get back to their little local station on a two carriage local service.

May is Resolutions month and this year there was only one resolution to debate - A call to increase awareness of the subtle signs of ovarian cancer. It is a shocking statistic that a woman dies every 2 hours of this disease in the UK! It mainly affects post menopausal women but can strike at any age. As the symptoms are often confused with other conditions, such as IBS, diagnosis often delayed. The most common symptoms are:

Constantly feeling bloated Swollen tummy Pain or discomfort in tummy or pelvic area Feeling full quickly when eating, or loss of appetite Urgency or frequency of urination

Any woman with symptoms should seek advice. After a short video the President read the briefing paper and a vote was taken – it was decided to support the motion unanimously. Our decision will be sent to the Annual Meeting delegate.

AVEBURY PARISH COUNCIL

Headlines from Avebury Parish Council's online meeting on 4 May 2021

Road safety: We agreed to install T junction warning signs on the A4361 on either side of Nash Lane having obtained Wiltshire Council's approval, and thanked Beckhampton Stables for helping us to fund them.

Local issues: We supported a full planning application to replace a garden shed at Rose Cottage in the High Street and decided to meet later in the month to consider an application for listed building consent for refurbishment and redecoration at Truslowe Manor. Work on planning the installation of a Speed Indicator Device (SID) continues. It seems unlikely that we will be able to re-install the handrail alongside the concrete steps leading from the Waggon and Horses layby into Beckhampton given the high cost suggested by an estimate. We began discussions of an offer from the National Trust to make the chapel available as a community exhibition space for a defined period of time and to secure a loan for funding new play equipment. We noted that the bench replacing one destroyed by van at West Kennett layby had recently been installed on the play area. The wire fencing surrounding the play area has been repaired.

The Ridgeway: We continue to discuss with Wiltshire Council how it proposes to protect the Ridgeway and facilitate its use by walkers and horse-riders, especially but not only during the period of the summer solstice.

Summer Solstice: A comprehensive paper focusing on management and the expectations of the community and other interest groups, prepared by Zandria Service, was tabled, considered, and agreed. Wiltshire Council has confirmed that it will provide security arrangements and enforce parking restrictions. Once Wiltshire Council's approval has been obtained, APC will set up a car access scheme, for which arrangements will be announced on the noticeboards in Beckhampton, Avebury Trusloe, and West Kennett and at the community shop and also on Facebook. We have been told that police officers will maintain a visible presence in the village throughout the long weekend.

Dates of next meetings: an ordinary meeting on 1 June at 19h30 in the Social Centre. As always, residents wishing to participate in these meetings are most welcome to do so. **Draft minutes of this meeting may be found on the Avebury**

The Committee met via Zoom in April and welcomed the reopening of the hall. There was a discussion about future uses of the hall which the committee agreed would be an ongoing project. Stoned in Lockeridge

I would like to put on record the help and encouragement of Douglas Adams and Brian Cox in writing this explanation about why, and how, the stones seen around Lockeridge came to be there.

Many years ago, a young ambitious lad called Zaphod, a student at an academic college for astro-science on the planet Magerethea, was asked to dispose of a cluster of meteorite droppings that were blocking the construction of a hyperspace bypass. The Vogon construction workers had refused to do this work because they were given false facts about a coronary virus that was said to be radiating from the stones.

Zaphod met the Vogon charge hand and told him that he had personally visited each of these stones and wrapped polyethylene around those parts of the stones that were leaking radiation, and that now, these stones could be loaded into the Vogon ships and removed from the area of the proposed hyperspace bypass and could be transported safely to another area. Zaphod had taken so little notice of the lessons from the Great Googlex professor while at college, that he only guessed at solutions to the great problems of state. Most people think he was lucky at getting most problems solved, while others explained that he had read a brief history of time, and gained an inkling about the mathematics of improbability drives for space ships, which he had determined to acquire.

Thus he convinced the Vogons to transport the stones into space, somewhere near Betelgeuse, and leave them in a heap outside the gravitational pull of the Betelgeusian star system.

He had not foreseen that he had selected this dump in the middle of the path used by stray meteorites coming around Jupiter and then passing the small, but insignificant lump called Earth. Thus it was that these stones were sucked into the path of the meteorites and deposited in the atmosphere of Earth, somewhere above Wiltingshire.

Because the stones were already arranged in a clump, covered in plastic, they stayed together and landed to the west of Marlborough. Primitives of the area tried using these stones to build stone circles, but were so intimidated by the Aveburian tribe nearby, who used much bigger stones to build circles that intertwined and overlapped, that they decided to just leave their stones where they lay.

Today, many citizens of Lockeridge, have a chance to elect new council members to re-arrange the stones after recording each and every one and its respective location so that all members of the community can apply for building permission to re-locate stones and build retaining walls, workshops or even castles.

This story is told so that you can prepare your own schedule of works to re-locate the stones within a 50m range of your front door and create a monument to Zaphod, or any other members of your family.

You may also choose to write and present your own explanation of the stones of Lockeridge and the editor might be prepared to accept bribes to publish them.

Ofsted 'Good school' News from MAY 2021

The start of May has been very wet and windy, as you will all know, and this has meant that we have had to have a few days of wet playtimes - although not as many as you might expect!). As a school we try to be outside as much as we can, with children playing in the light rain whenever possible. Sport and PE sessions also always continue unless the weather is dreadful. After several years of having this outdoor ethos we have found that our children are always keen to be out and are ready with their wet weather coats when needed. All of the staff are grateful to our parents who ensure that children come ready to be out in showery weather.

Curriculum

This term we have had a Modern Foreign Language week with children learning to speak in French and Spanish. It was really wonderful to walk around our delightful little school and hear different children learning these new skills. I loved working with my class to learn some Spanish words and phrases and was incredibly grateful that one of our parents, Mrs. Gonzalez from the Marlborough School of Languages, came in to work with the Year4/5 children for an afternoon. We looked at the names of family members with a song to help them practice these more. This class had a food tasting day and made presentations about Spain in pairs. The children in Year 6 focused on learning French and had a food tasting day, which they seemed to love. They learnt important words and phrases in French, and you could hear them practicing them throughout the week. The youngest two classes learnt a mixture of French and Spanish. As well as learning simple

phrases they heard stories in different languages, made tapas for the class and found out about these places. We have continued to practice all that we learnt this week and will, of course, continue in the coming weeks and months.

Tiny Beastie Leaving the School!

As you will remember I previously told you about the very large group of tadpoles we have had in Wrens class (Rec and Year 1). These tiny creatures have been growing and changing over the last 12 weeks and we have now been able to release some of the tiny frogs into the pond that they came from. The children have been terrific at looking after them. The work that has come from these year groups, as part of their continous provision has been astonishing. Mrs. McQue, class teacher, said "It has been delightful to see the children taking care of these little amphibians so carefully. They have drawn pictures of them, written about them and completed research to find out more about them. We are so pleased that so many of them have become frogs and that we can release them back into the pond".

More Arrivals!

It won't be long after the frogs and froglets leave the school before we welcome several eggs to the school. These are going into Wrens class to be incubated and to hatch out. The staff and children are all extremely excited while they wait for them to come. After they have hatched, they will be going to live with one of our staff members. I will give you more updates about them once they have arrived.

ELSA

As with many schools we have a marvellous and inspiring ELSA in our school. ELSA stands for Emotional Literacy Support Assistant.

Our ELSA is Mrs. Watts, who has worked at Kennet Valley for over 20 years. An ELSA should be a warm and caring person who wants to help your child feel happy in school and to reach their potential educationally – and we would all agree that this is absolutely true of Mrs. Watts. An ELSA's aim is to remove the barriers

to learning and to have happy children in school and at home. Mrs. Watts works with a variety of children within the school and provides fantastic support for them. As part of the role of ELSA Mrs. Watts works with other practitioners from local schools and with members of Wiltshire Council's Behaviour Support and Educational Psychology Team. I know that we are not the only school that has found that after lockdown there are more children and families that need support, and an ELSA is ideal for helping with anxiety and hurdles in learning.

Mrs. Watts said "As soon as I had completed my basic ELSA training, many years ago, I knew that I wanted to specialise, I feel very lucky to be well supported by the school and supervisors in the local cluster group. I simply try to be inclusive, fair and, above all, kind. The sessions are very definitely child led. It has been an unpredictable, scary times for us all and giving children the skills to cope with such uncertainty is more important than ever before"

I would like to take this opportunity to say a BIG thank you to Mrs. Watts for all her hard work and commitment to this vital school role.

Update from the National Trust June 2021

Open again!

No-one can deny that it's been a bit of a struggle for everyone this year, but at last we can say that most of the National Trust facilities and attractions are open for business.

We were able to welcome back visitors in early March with the reopening of our visitor car park, toilets and provision of a limited take-away offer. Over the next few weeks, we re-opened our Visitor Reception in the Barn and Avebury Manor Garden via a booking system. The National Trust shop and Cobblestones second-hand bookshop opened in April – do pop in and have a look at the spring range and the new books. In mid-May the Stables Gallery of the Alexander Keiller Museum welcomed its first visitors of the year, and Avebury Manor has re-opened its doors for guided tours on Fridays to Sundays.

Although we have opened up again, due to the need for social distancing, we can only accommodate limited numbers of visitors at any one time in the manor and museum – time will tell how long we will have to work with these restrictions, but for now it is wonderful to be able to give people more choice when they visit.

With the half-term upon us we're hoping that the weather is kind and we'll have lots of happy children enjoying nature themed activities.

Summer Solstice

This year, the National Trust is asking visitors not to come to Avebury for Solstice celebrations. We're asking people to respect the ongoing Government restrictions and not to travel to the area in order to avoid the potential impact that large gatherings of people could have on local communities.

We have consulted with Avebury Parish Council, Wiltshire Police and Wiltshire Council, and have agreed that our car park, toilets and catering facilities will operate as normal during our standard daytime opening hours. We will not however provide any facilitates overnight this year. In addition, Police and Security will be on site throughout the Solstice weekend.

Our priority is always to ensure the safety and wellbeing of staff, volunteers, residents and visitors. We believe that the best way to do this is to continue to follow Government and National Trust guidance on mass gatherings, which will remain in place until at least the Solstice weekend. Could you help to discover more Stone Stiles in Gloucestershire and beyond?

In 2020 Peter Wilson, launched ⁷The Gloucestershire Stone Stile Project'.

Supported by CPRE Gloucestershire the Countryside Charity, English Heritage and the Cotteswold Naturalists Field Club, Peter's aim was to produce a record of every remaining stone stile in the ancient county of Gloucestershire before they are lost forever. Through support from volunteers and members of these groups and other keen walkers he has received over 800 contributions. For centuries stiles have provided access to locals walking along pathways as they went about their business whilst preventing sheep and cattle from straying further afield. No-one knows for sure how many stiles there were originally as despite their historic value, scores of them have been abandoned and some now lost forever. It's thought however there are at least 100 more stone stiles yet to be mapped.

There are three main types of stone stiles: slit stiles, also known as 'squeeze' stiles are usually two upright stones too narrow for farm animals to pass through, slab stiles vary in height and can prove difficult to negotiate even for the most energetic walker! The less common stile is the step and even with a series of flat stones protruding out from a stone wall, these can be tricky to climb over. You may come across some or all of these types of stone stiles in and around the parish of Upper Kennett.

So if you are out walking and you spot a stone stile, or if you know of an existing stile, please photograph it, if possible from both sides. Download a Stile Recording Form by going to the CPRE website, https://www.cpreglos.org.uk/creating-a-record-of-gloucestershire-stone-stiles/ Please give as much information as possible before emailing the form to: peter-wilson@woodchestervalleyvillage.co.uk. 'Duplicate' notifications are fine as you may have been able to provide more information on the location and history of the stile and ...you may take a better picture. As well as recording the type of stile and its OS location, we are seeking information on the history, geology and landscape setting relating to each stile. If you have a particular interest in any of these areas please contact Peter.

Due to the tremendous response to the Project the second phase is being started earlier than expected. We now have a new volunteer who has joined the team. He has begun recording all the information from our contributors onto an analysed spread sheet. This is a mammoth task which we are seeking volunteers to help.

The final phase of the Project is the production of an interactive App from all the information received. The App will show the location of the stiles and will encourage more people to explore our wonderful county adding to their enjoyment of country walks. It will also help wheelchair and scooter users and families with children in buggies to plan their walks.

There are many stiles out there just waiting to be discovered but please do remember the Countryside Code – Respect other people, Protect the natural environment, Follow advice and local signs and Obey social distancing regulations.




