A View from the Rectory

"We are all different, but each of us has his own best to offer. The responsibility for the way we live life with all its challenges, sadness and joy, is ours alone. If we do this well, it will also be good for our neighbours... we may feel powerless alone, but the joint efforts of individuals can defeat the evils of our time. Together they can create a stable, free and considerate society." Said the Queen in 1975.

Marking the Jubilee is not, as someone told me, some kind of 'jingoistic expression of adoration of the monarchy,' but rather an opportunity to reflect upon the example of someone who plays a significant spiritual role in leadership and who offers a glimpse of what it means to be a Servant Leader in the manner of Jesus.

The reading most of the nation will hear over the Jubilee weekend states that "whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant", and that's exactly what the Queen has done in her long life. Since 1952 the Queen has worked tirelessly for the country and Commonwealth she vowed to serve 'her whole life whether it be long or short'. Her workload has increased year on year at a rate of 25% and on top of all that serving her God and country entails at the age of 96, the Queen is a proud grandmother, great-grandmother, and has 30 godchildren. She is neither too busy nor too old to serve others and takes a deep interest in those she meets, showing a genuine interest in the lives lived by people from all walks of life.

Jesus' concept of servant leadership challenges today's cult of celebrity, quick fame and obsession with power and control and reveals a pattern of leadership that embraces deep humility, disregards personal agendas, and puts others first. This, I think, is what we've witnessed in Her Majesty's reign and is what makes her leadership so distinctive. She rose to the challenge presented to her, embraced her role with grace and humility, served diligently and demonstrated her humanity, never loosing sight of who she serves first, God.

During the Queen's reign many customs and traditions have changed, values have altered, and rights for us as individuals seem at times to replace our duty and responsibilities to others and to the communities in which we live. Yet despite all of this change, Her Majesty remains a constant; a reminder of servant leadership, integrity, dedication, and example. The root of this is the Queen's profound faith, personal yet public, and she is acutely aware that "whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant." In the manner of Jesus she has done so, her faith an inclusive, human, hopeful quiet beacon for us

I shall remember her dignity in personal and family crises; her grace when she paid the first state visit to Ireland and her words of hope, healing and peace, her actions that spoke of forgiveness, and the humility that underpinned her sensitivity. I believe she challenges all of us to reflect on how we serve one another in our homes, work and family life.

AVEBURY PARISH COUNCIL

Headlines from Avebury Parish Council's meeting on 3 May 2022

Annual Village Meeting: The meeting, which will review APC's annual report and hear your preferred priorities for the year ahead, will be held in the Sports and Social Club on 24 May at 19h00. Refreshments will be offered from 18h30. All are very welcome.

A4361: The speed indicator device (SID) was moved from the site on the Swindon Road to the one on the Beckhampton Road on 1 May. Data downloaded from the Swindon Road location indicated that there were over 100,000 southbound vehicles per month. 85% of the vehicles approaching the SID did so at an average speed of 38.6mph. As the SID location is well inside the 30mph restriction, most vehicles are exceeding the speed limit. The dataset will go to the Police and Crime Commissioner at his request.

Beckhampton: We asked Wiltshire Council to mow a 3-metre strip at the base of the roundabout to ensure visibility for drivers whilst leaving the centre for rewilding.

Motor cycle noise: Following complaints, we decided to ask Wiltshire Council to select Beckhampton as one of the locations for an acoustic camera trial.

Platinum Jubilee: Responses to a questionnaire seeking opinions on the best way to mark the Platinum Jubilee had suggested that street parties were the most favoured option. The National Trust will be leading a beacon-lighting event on Waden Hill on 2 June preceded by a service in St James's church followed by refreshments in the Social Centre. The Sports and Social Club plans to host a BBQ on 4 June. The event will also mark the formal re-opening of the Club.

Solstice: Wiltshire Highways has decided that the High Street should be closed from 06h00 on Monday 20 June until the end of the day on Wednesday 22 June 2022. Parking restrictions there and elsewhere would be in place from 06h00 Sunday 19 June until 12 noon Wednesday 22 June 2022. Temporary closure of AVE5 was also being considered. We await formal notification of these arrangements. As advised in UKN last month, we will set up a residents' car permit scheme to allow access to roads closed by Wiltshire Council and where there are parking restrictions on roadsides often used by residents for parking. Permits will be available from Elements in Green Street on 7 June (17h30-19h), 8 June (19h-21h), and 13 June (18h-20h). Please bring proof of address.

Date and place of next meeting: 7 June at 19h30 in the Social Centre. As always, residents wishing to participate in these meetings are most welcome to do so.

AVEBURY SOCIAL CENTRE

The Committee met in April for their quarterly meeting. Matters discussed included the issue of car charging from the Social Centre and the problems this may cause in the future. It was felt that this may be an increasing issue in the future and possibly it is a matter that might need to be addressed by the NT or PC, given the number of visitors that come by car. It was agreed that the shed should be repaired and painted with preservative. Mike Polack reported on a successful first Village Soup Lunch and that another be held in May but not June due to the Queen's Jubilee. It was noted that the hall had been kept deliberately free over the four days for the use of the village – it will be used on the Thursday and is reserved to use on the Sunday if wet and/or no other options are available for the High Street and other village members not doing Street parties, but no firm plans have been made to date.

The Treasurer though not in attendance had circulated detailed accounts which were healthy due to his diligence in gaining grants which has allowed the committee to address items of maintenance despite a difficult two years with lettings. The top porch is currently undergoing repairs and repainting in the near future to match the entrance porch.

The matter of changing the current Trustee Constitution to a C.I.O has been discussed over the past few months, but having carefully considered ACRE advice, costs involved and given the insurance we have and the level of activity within the hall it was decided to keep our current position, but it was agreed that this would be reviewed in a couple of years as a matter of good practice.

A request for dimmer lights at the east end of the hall was agreed in principle, and the Chairman will contact the electrician for costings.

The next meeting will be our AGM on Monday July 18th at 7.30pm in the Social Centre when all our welcome.

Update from the National Trust Summer Solstice 2022

The Summer Solstice will soon be here again, and this will be the first 'normal' Solstice since 2019. As usual we have been working closely with the Police, Wiltshire Council, Dorset and Wiltshire Fire and Rescue, St John Ambulance, Avebury Parish Council and local Pagan groups to ensure a safe and peaceful Solstice for everyone.

We'll have staff on duty over the weekend before Solstice (18/19 June) and then we'll start the usual 24-hour shift system at 8am on Monday 20 June, which will continue until 6.30pm on Wednesday 22 June.

The small National Trust campsite will be open from 10am on Monday 20 June until 2pm on Wednesday 22 June.

The main car park will be open as usual with extended hours on 20 June to accommodate evening visitors. However, the Planning Condition preventing us from allowing vehicles built or adapted for sleeping to stay overnight (including coaches and high-sided vehicles), will still be in force, so we will not be admitting these vehicles from Monday 13 June to Thursday 23 June, with a 2.1m height barrier in place on the entrance to the car park.

Due to an increased chance of people arriving early and wanting to stay for the duration, security staff will be clearing and closing the car park at the normal time of 6.30pm on 17, 18, 19 and 22 June.

We will also be providing additional car parking in our manor parkland on the evening of Monday 20 June through to the morning of Tuesday 21

The location of additional toilets, waste and recycle bins in the National Trust High Street car park worked well in previous years, so we'll be doing the same again. This means fencing off a section to create a compound and ensure safe pedestrian access. There will be some parking restrictions in place from Friday 17 June to enable the Rangers to install the fencing. As usual, parking will be limited during this period, so if you have alternative means of travel please do consider using it. Valid residents permits or Blue Badges will be required to park in the High Street car

Wiltshire Police will have a base in the village and will be out patrolling the site with National Trust staff, volunteers and St John Ambulance. National Trust staff and volunteers, along with St John Ambulance and security staff, will be based in the Chapel on Green Street.

There will be a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order in place over Solstice. Avebury Parish Council and Wiltshire Council are finalising the details of the permit system this year, and more information will be available via the Parish Council soon. Food and drinks over the Solstice period will be available as follows:

Two New Grants For Kennet Valley Hall's **New Project**

The Hall Committee are delighted to announce the receipt of new funding to enable the implementation of their new project.

This new project has been planned for some time, partly because of the need to remove both the existing Field Shelter and Trim Trail, originally installed in 2004, but now starting to disintegrate. The project plan is to replace the existing and popular shelter with a similar structure, and to replace the Trim Trail with an Outside Gym, incorporating a variety of different forms of fitness apparatus. The whole project is planned to be completed by early June.

This project would not have been possible without the support of the Post Code Lottery and their Players, who have provided a grant of £10000. Plus our local Marlborough Area Board who have supported the Hall over the years, this time with a grant of circa £4000. We thank both organisations for their most generous support. The balance of the project cost, circa £10000, will come from KVH's own funds.




