A View from the Rectory

Books leave the Rectory shelves on a frequent basis, sent forth like carrier pigeons, and occasionally some return home to roost. One Sunday in May two of the books flew home. Apparently they had been 'a real gift' to the reader in her attempt to answer the big questions about God and Life in general. Sometimes books take you from where it feels comfortable to the edge of understanding, where you are invited to let go of what you think you know, and walk on untested 'holy ground'. John Phillip Newell, Richard Rohr and Barbara Brown Taylor are three authors who invite the reader to go from the centre to the edge of faith – finding common ground with others who are also exploring the edges of *their* faith.

Early in the Christian history of our islands Celtic monks practiced something called 'Peregrination'. The root of that word is Latin, from an old term meaning pilgrim or someone who becomes a foreigner in a new land. Think peregrine falcon: a falcon's journey can take it from the Arctic Circle to South America and back again in a single year. Think St Brendan the Navigator, who spent seven long years on the sea in a coracle seeking the Island of Hy-Brazil, abandoning his old, preconceived ideas and boundaries of trust and faith to seek and find new life beyond the safe quayside in the wide and open sea.

I have found that every time I have taken the risk to move out of my comfort zone spiritually, mentally, emotionally or creatively, I have caught something of the peregrination of God's Spirit. There has always been a sense of 'oh, you are there AS WELL' and real joy finding our boundaries are self-imposed, and can be challenged. But going beyond possibilities to the edge does not mean abandoning the centre - on the contrary. It is a bit like having the job of a doorkeeper, who must know fully what is within, and continue to see and seek and engage with what lies beyond the door.

I was asked recently why I 'find it easy to talk to strange people with strange ideas and beliefs' - I wish I could have replied 'peregrination' but the individual asking already thought I was a few wags short of a dog's tail so I merely smiled and said 'because a stranger is friend you haven't met yet'. If I am rooted and grounded in the core of faith, a loving God, then it becomes possible to be a peregrine, a pilgrim, in each encounter with another. Pilgrims go with the expectation of being changed and to encounter God somewhere on the path. Perhaps these words from a hymn sum it up best for me literally and metaphorically:

'This my song, O God of all the nations,

A song of peace for lands afar from mine:

This is my home, the country where my heart is,

Here are my hopes, my dreams, my holy shrine:

But other hearts in other lands are beating

With hopes and dreams as true and high as mine.'

Summer is upon us and perhaps we shall travel and others travelling might encounter us. I wonder if we all could do with trying a bit of 'peregrination'?



Meanwhile, in our new, fabulous Community Hall we served a wonderful array of cakes and ran a tempting bric-a-brac stall. Both proved popular as we welcomed people from across the Benefice and surrounding villages. Over 50 people supported us and over £500 was raised, exceeding expectations. Once expenses have been paid the remainder will go towards the new amplification system in the church. The servers and bakers, as ever, did a fantastic job - many thanks.



Update from the **National Trust**

It's almost that time of year again; the Summer Solstice will soon be here with expected gatherings at Avebury on the evening of Tuesday 20 June and morning of Wednesday 21 June.

As usual, the National Trust has been working closely with Wiltshire Police, Wiltshire Council, Dorset and Wiltshire Fire and Rescue, St John Ambulance, Avebury Parish Council, and local groups to ensure a safe and peaceful Solstice for everyone.

We'll have staff on duty over the weekend prior to Solstice, and then we'll begin a 24-hour shift system beginning at 8am on Tuesday 20 June, and continuing until 6.30pm on Thursday 22 June.

The small National Trust campsite in the overflow car park will be open from 10am on Tuesday 20 June, until 2pm on Thursday 22 June. The planning condition in force here prevents us from allowing overnighting in vehicles; therefore, all campers are required to be in the designated camping area, in tents.

The main car park will be open as

usual with extended hours on Tuesday 20 June to accommodate evening visitors. To help us manage this car park safely and effectively, for the enjoyment and ease of Summer Solstice all, security staff will be helping us to clear and close the car park at the normal time of 6pm on 17, 18, 19, and 22 June.

> Subject to ground conditions, additional parking will also be provided in the Manor Parkland on the evening of Tuesday 20 June through to the morning of Wednesday 21 June. Due to the protected and sensitive nature of the ground, no large vehicles can be admitted here and a 2.1m height barrier will be in place.

The location of additional toilets and waste and recycling bins in the National Trust High Street car park worked well in previous years, so we'll be doing the same again. This means fencing off a section to create a compound and ensure safe pedestrian access. There will be some parking restrictions in place from Friday 16 June to enable the Ranger Team to install this fencing. As usual, parking here will be limited during this period, so if you telephone number during Solstice for have alternative means of travel, please consider using it. You will need a valid access permit or Blue Badge to park in the High Street car park. Resident access permits will be issued by the Parish Council; more information will be

available soon. The details of the permit system are currently being finalised by the Parish Council and Wilshire Council as part of a Temporary Traffic Regulation **Order** that will be in place over Solstice.

Wiltshire Police will be out patrolling the site with National Trust staff, volunteers, St John Ambulance, and security staff. National Trust staff and volunteers, along with St John Ambulance and security staff, will be based in the Chapel on Green Street.

National Trust food and drink provisions will be available in the Circles Restaurant as usual over the whole Solstice period. This will be supplemented by a simple over-night provision from the Coach House Café from Tuesday 20 June 6pm to Wednesday 21 June 8am, seamlessly followed by an early breakfast offer from 8am in the Circles Restaurant.

Avebury Manor will be closed from Tuesday 20 to Thursday 22 June inclusive, all other elements of our visitor offer will be open as usual.

Issues raised were parking, the state of the local roads, verge cutting, Solstice arrangements and the Parish Council accounts. SOLSTICE PLANNING

With just over a month to go, plans are taking shape for this year's Summer Solstice. Please keep an eye out for notices about arrangements.

PARKING:

Parking over the Solstice is always an issue and there is a change this year – you will need permits for parking and access. These will again be available for residents to allow access to the High Street and other roads as well as on-street parking while preventing parking where it is not allowed. Please watch out for information on the local Social Media and Whatsapp groups and local notice boards. Please help neighbours who might not know about the permits by telling them about the scheme and how they can get a permit

Permits will be issued and residents should make sure that they have a permit **before** the Solstice

A4361 – we agreed to take up the state of the A4361 between the Beckhampton roundabout and Winterbourne Monkton as the state of the surface is now causing great concern about road

<u>Policies</u> – all APC policies are under review at present and will be available on the Parish website (www.aveburyparishcouncil.org) in due course.

Parking - illegal parking throughout the Parish is becoming more of a problem and we agreed to contact our local Councillor for support in getting the Parking Enforcement Team to visit more regularly. This has now been

done and the Parking team will visit more often, particularly at busy times.

Road safety – we received a report recently of a child riding a Mini Moto locally. Most mini motos, quad bikes and other off-road vehicles cannot legally be ridden on the road, nor can they be used on pavements, footpaths, cycle paths, on parkland, common land or wasteland. They can only be ridden legally on dedicated sites or private land (with the permission of the landowner).

Ringers Jonathan and Michele played key roles in organising this well attended event.

KEEP SAFE IN THE COUNTRY

Please take care when out and about in the countryside. Remember to close gates, avoid livestock and keep to designated paths. Parents – please ensure that your children keep safe. Farms are working environments with potential risks from equipment and livestock.

POLITE REMINDER – PLEASE PICK **UP AFTER YOUR DOG**

Complaints have been received of dog fouling in Lockeridge, please pick up after your dog. Always take bags with you when out walking and do not leave them to pick up later, they are not there for decorating trees and hedges, can cause fatalities if ingested by cattle and a very nasty infection called toxocariasis in humans.

TREE AND HEDGE CUTTING ADVICE

The RSPB recommend not cutting hedges and trees between March and August as this is the main breeding season for nesting birds, although some birds may nest outside this period. It is an offence under Section 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act of 1981 to intentionally take, damage or destroy the

nest of any wild bird while it is in use or being built, or to intentionally kill, injure or take chicks or adults, or intentionally take or destroy any eggs. It is an intentional act, for example, if you or your neighbour know there is an active nest in the hedge and still cut the hedge, damaging or destroying the nest or contents in the process. If someone is cutting a hedge during this period, speak to them and politely mention the risk to birds nests, and the laws protecting nests. If they proceed, and you know there is an active nest at risk, contact the police on 101, and ask for a reference number.

BOOKS IN THE BUS SHELTER – WEST OVERTON

The books in the bus shelter continue to be a valuable and well used resource for the local community but recently it seems to have become a dumping ground for DVD's. Please can we request only books be placed in there and then only if there is sufficient space on the shelves to accommodate them.

Avebury and Stonehenge Archaeological and Historical Research Group

The first 'on-site' meeting of the Avebury and Stonehenge Archaeological and Historical Research Group (ASAHRG) since the pandemic took place at Avebury Club at the end of April. We have a widespread and an international membership so the hybrid facility was essential and run by David Dawson, Director of Wiltshire Museum.

The Group is an independent body of archaeologists and historians who research not only the upstanding but the buried archaeology, the records of others who have done so in the past, the history of the area, the changing landscape, ancient soils and land use and changes in - for instance - river flow patterns.

One of the reports received was in relation to the digitisation of the big paperwork archive held by the Alexander Keiller Museum, a collaborative project involving several bodies and many volunteers.


