A View from the Rectory

In the heart of the Berwyn Mountains in Wales stands a small church surrounded by ancient yews; it is a magical place, a thin place where you feel heaven and earth touch and the Saints stand around you. It is dedicated to the Celtic holy woman, St Melangell, who is named in ancient tales as the Saviour of the Hare. The hare is an ancient Jewish and Christian and Pagan mystical sign of the Trinity and the Holy Spirit, images of the three hares being found in German Synagogues and Christian churches, including one in Devon and the Middle East.

We are told that in the 7th century a prince named Brochwel was out hunting in the forest when his hounds chased a hare. The terrified creature ran as fast as the wind and sought refuge under the cloak of a young woman deep in prayer in the midst of a thicket of brambles.

She said she was Melangell, the daughter of an Irish king who required her to marry and not to dedicate her life to prayer and to God. So she fled to Wales to live alone in the wilderness. The prince was so moved by her story that he gave her part of his lands to be a sanctuary. Hares were given special protection and it was forbidden to hunt them. From that time forth they accompanied her everywhere she went, and became known as ‘Melangell’s lambs.’

Melangell’s reputation for holiness grew, and pilgrims from all over Wales made the dangerous journey over boggy moorland and through treacherous mountain passes, seeking healing and refuge, as the hare had once done, beneath her cloak of compassion. Many miracles took place at her woodland sanctuary and sacred spring on the hillside above. Around 1160 C.E. a stone church was built with a shrine and today the Shrine Church of Saint Melangell continues to be a Pilgrims’ Church, and visitors of all faiths and spiritual paths come from all over Britain and around the world to the place where a young woman saved a creature from certain death.

As we enter spring and take advantage of the stretch in the daylight hours you may well spot a hare or even three together in the bright early dawn light or at the end of the day as the last rays cast golden hues over the still empty fields. Perhaps it is not our lot to shelter a hare beneath our coat flaps, but we are all asked to do more than simply admire the beauty of creation from afar, or treat its creatures and the earth itself with the arrogance that comes from feeling humans are called to dominate creation. As we enter Lent, the Christian time of fasting and prayer and contemplation, seeking to change our lives and grow spiritually, perhaps we might think of increasing our awareness of our dependence on the earth and all that dwells therein. Perhaps we might fast from something that we know does harm, decrease our carbon footprint and in doing so not commit for a mere 40 days but for the days that come after.

When the question comes ‘what are you giving up for Lent?’ what will our answer be?

BISHOP ANDREW'S BENEFICE WALK SUNDAY 3RD APRIL, 9.00AM - 12.30PM

Bishop Andrew, who is the Bishop of Ramsbury (but lives in Marlborough), has kindly agreed to come and support this walk for fundraising for our group of seven churches known as the Upper Kennet Benefice.

The walk will be between the churches north of the A4, from Broad Hinton to Avebury, which is approximately five miles along footpaths, and will take in the churches of Winterbourne Bassett, Berwick Bassett and Winterbourne Monkton and will finish at Avebury Church where refreshments will be available from 11 am. Walkers are welcome to join (or leave!) at any of the churches along the way. Bishop Andrew has also agreed to do a similar walk between the churches south of the A4 at a later date – ie East Kennett, West Overton and Fyfield.

Preferably by prior arrangement, lifts will be available from Avebury to return walkers to their cars left at the start at Broad Hinton or en route.

AVEBURY PARISH COUNCIL

Headlines from Avebury Parish Council's meeting on 1 February 2022

A4: Following a presentation given to him in November by the chairs of Preshute, Kennet Valley, and Avebury parish councils, Danny Kruger MP has written to ministers in the Departments for Transport and for Culture, Media and Sport urging them to act to improve road safety on the A4 between Overton Hill and Beckhampton by implementing the Avebury Transport Strategy, which was agreed by all stakeholders in 2015.

B4003: Wiltshire Council has decided to implement the multi-stakeholder agreement reached in January 2019 to reshape the layby. Work will be undertaken in three stages: completing the yellow lines and starting occasional enforcement; reducing the layby to three car lengths and resurfacing and edging it; and keeping reconstruction of the adjacent verges under review, taking action if vehicles park on them.

Community Exhibition Space in the Chapel: We heard that six organisations had committed to exhibit with three others showing strong interest. A meeting to review progress is planned for March.

Defibrillator: A training session on how to use a defibrillator is planned for 3 March. Please contact Maggie Lewis on T. 01672 539607 if you would like to go on it.

National Trust: In a detailed update, we were told that part of the High Street car park would be closed to allow scheduled tree works to be carried out and that pathway improvement works to Windmill Hill had been completed, which we warmly welcomed.

Platinum Jubilee: We started a discussion about ways in which the village might celebrate this milestone in the reign of Queen Elizabeth II. Do you have a suggestion? Please send it to clerk@aveburyparishcouncil.org or speak to one of your Councillors.

Rights of Way: In discussion, it was noted that AVE14 was in urgent need of repair. We agreed to send a report, with photographic evidence, to Wiltshire Council. There are other rights of way that have been severely damaged.

Waiting for SID: We heard that Ringway, Wiltshire Council's contractor, had dug two small holes for the foundations of poles to support our Speed Indicator Device, which will be installed at one of two locations at the entrance to the village on the A4361. We await Ringway's return to enlarge the holes and fill them with concrete, allowing us to get our SID into action.

Date and place of next meeting: 1 March at 19h30 in the Social Centre. As always, residents wishing to participate in these meetings are most welcome to do so.

Do you have an issue to bring to the parish council?

Please come to our meeting and raise it there. Let us know if you cannot attend in person and we will try to find a way for you to join virtually instead. And if that is not possible for you, please report your concern to one of us. Our contact details are on the noticeboards.

We can address your issue only if we know about it!

Parish Councillor Vacancy in Avebury

Qualifications to be a Councillor as follows:

A person is qualified to be elected and to be a councillor if they are a British, Commonwealth, Irish or European Union citizen and on the relevant day (that is, the day of nomination or election) they are 18 or over.

In addition, the person **must meet at least one of the following criteria:**

- ◇ On the relevant day and thereafter they continue to be on the electoral register for the parish, or
- ◇ During the whole of the twelve months before that day they have owned or tenanted land or premises in the parish, or
- ◇ During the whole of the twelve months before that day their principal or only place of work has been in the parish, or
- ◇ During the whole of the twelve months before that day they have resided in the parish or within 4.8 kilometres (three miles) of it.

Free high-vis garments

Kier, in conjunction with Thames Water, kindly donated a number of high-vis garments to the villagers of Lower Fyfield. A quick photo/presentation was made on Saturday the 22nd of January. The high-vis items were for local residents as well as their dogs and ponies! Kier/Thames Water are conscious of the increased traffic and disruption to the village during the improvements at the water works. They wanted to donate the items as a way to improve the safety for everyone who uses the lane, especially during the shorter winter days.

LOCKERIDGE COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

Following concerns from parishioners about traffic safety in the local area the Lockeridge Community Speedwatch Team began its patrols in October 2021 at different times of the day and from several locations in the village. Details of vehicles that exceed the 20mph limit are sent to Wiltshire Police for further action. In general, approximately 10% of drivers were speeding and by the end of December 2021 132 drivers had been contacted by the Police. Please drive carefully through our villages and lanes and observe the speed limits.

TREE AND HEDGE CUTTING ADVICE

The RSPB recommend not cutting hedges and trees between March and August as this is the main breeding season for nesting birds, although some birds may nest outside this period. It is an offence under Section 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act of 1981 to intentionally take, damage or destroy the nest of any wild bird while it is in use or being built, or to intentionally kill, injure or take chicks or adults, or intentionally

take or destroy any eggs. It is an intentional act, for example, if you or your neighbour know there is an active nest in the hedge and still cut the hedge, damaging or destroying the nest or contents in the process. If someone is cutting a hedge during this period, speak to them and politely mention the risk to birds' nests, and the laws protecting nests. If they proceed, and **you know** there is an **active nest at risk**, contact the police on 101, and ask for a reference number.

TREES IN A CONSERVATION AREA

All three of our villages lie within an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, **Lockeridge is in a Conservation Area.** Local planning authorities are under a duty to preserve or enhance the character or appearance of conservation areas as a whole. A key part of that character and appearance may be the trees.

Anyone proposing to carry out works to a tree in a conservation area must give at least six weeks notice to the local planning authority. There are exceptions to this requirement, including when the tree is dead, dying or has become dangerous. This notice period gives the local planning authority the opportunity to decide if it is necessary to impose a tree preservation order on the tree in order to discharge its duty to have special regard to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the conservation area. If the authority decides the tree is not a part of the special character or appearance of the area it may give consent. Otherwise, it should refuse consent and consider imposing a tree preservation order. It is a criminal offence to carry out works to a tree where consent has been refused or where notice was required and not served on

the local planning authority.

Where a tree in a conservation area has been removed illegally or because it is dead, dying or dangerous or causing a nuisance, a replacement tree must be planted by law. The tree must be of an appropriate size and species. The local planning authority can enforce this requirement and ultimately come onto the land itself to carry out the planting and then recover the cost from the owner.

Please note – there is no fee for applying for permission to carry out works to trees in a Wiltshire Conservation Area and most local tree surgeons will be more than happy to complete and submit the application on your behalf.

DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING

On the morning of Sunday 23rd January a cheery group of villagers met in the Kennet Valley Hall for defibrillator training delivered by Julia Doel from the South West Ambulance Service. Carer charity is looking for volunteer befrienders

Carer Support Wiltshire are looking to expand their team of Here to Talk volunteers following a surge in demand from unpaid carers who are experiencing feelings of isolation and need someone to talk to.

Here to Talk volunteers provide regular phone conversations to unpaid carers who feel they would benefit from having someone to chat with.

Anyone who is interested in this flexible volunteering role and can commit to the minimum of half an hour every two weeks is encouraged to get in touch, says Volunteer Recruitment Manager Amanda Rothwell.

"Our telephone befriending service has helped to ease feelings of isolation for hundreds of unpaid carers. It's been more in demand since the pandemic began, but unpaid carers are often isolated even when there aren't any restrictions. When you are caring for someone who is ill, or has a condition or disability, it can be difficult to leave the house. If you're the only person in your friendship group who is a carer, it can feel isolating."

Those who would like to volunteer and who meet the criteria will be provided by Carer Support Wiltshire with full training on subjects such as listening skills, confidentiality, safeguarding, mental health awareness and communication.

Successful applicants will have a friendly approach with good listening skills, be non-judgemental with respect for different lifestyles and empathetic to the needs and concerns of unpaid carers.

The Kennett Brewery

Many of you have probably wondered what the story is behind the derelict buildings on either side of the A4 at West Kennett; well here is part of that story, which is an extract from **“The History of Winterbourne Monkton”** by **The History Boys**.

The brewery was owned by the Butler family and is mentioned in George Butler's will of 29th August 1868. The Butlers continue to own land and farm in the area.

The Kennett Brewery was put up for auction on 30th January 1882, for £10,000.

Consisting of The Brewhouse, Residence & Garden, 2 paddocks and a cottage plus 9 Public and Beer Houses

Lot 1 consisted of The Brewery and its Premises

- ◇ The Cross Keys, Front Marsh (The Parade), Marlborough
- ◇ The Cricketers, Kingsbury Street, Marlborough
- ◇ The Cross Keys, Wootton Bassett
- ◇ The New Inn, Winterbourne Monkton
- ◇ The Clock Beerhouse, Stert
- ◇ The Bell Inn, Overton
- ◇ The Rising Sun, Devizes
- ◇ A Public House 2 miles from West Kennett
- ◇ A Public House 4 miles from West Kennett

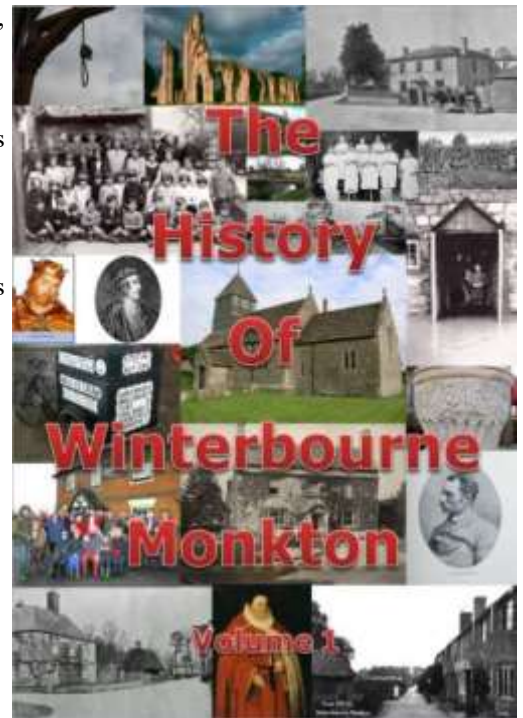
Lot 2 consisted of a freehold property on London Road, Marlborough (near the bridge over the River Kennet)

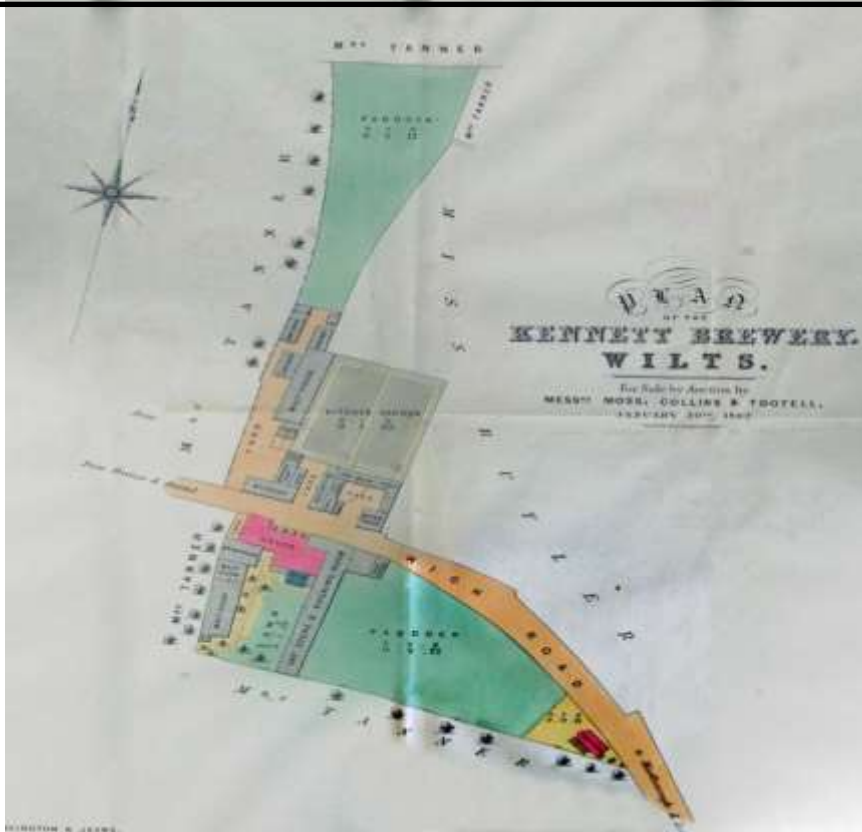
An offer was made by a Mr. Jarvis for £9,000; it is unlikely this was accepted as the brewery remained in the Butler's hands.

On 28th October 1920 The Kennett Brewery was sold to The Stroud Brewery of Stroud, Gloucestershire by William Stephen Butler.

It consisted of at that time (the colour indicates that they no longer exist as ale houses)

- ◇ The Brewery (now derelict, although some outbuildings still exist; see map)
- ◇ The Queens Head, 23 St Martins, Marlborough (until 2021, then a private dwelling)
- ◇ The Cross Keys, The Parade, Marlborough (until 1923, when site was redeveloped into Cross Keys House, since 2014 occupied by Withy King)
- ◇ The Cricketers Arms, Kingsbury Street, Marlborough (until 1996 following which it became Coles Restaurant, later in 2016 private dwellings)
- ◇ The New Inn, Winterbourne Monkton (Sarah Spackman)
- ◇ The Clock Inn, Stert, Urchfont (until 2002, then a private dwelling)
- ◇ The Wellington Arms, 46 High Street, Marlborough
- ◇ The Red Lion, Avebury
- ◇ 18 Marlborough Street, Swindon – Wescott Place Working Men's Club
- ◇ The Bell, West Overton
- ◇ The Vulcan, West Overton (Beerhouse until 1978, Shop & Post Office latterly run by Dick & Gilda Stannard who then moved to Avebury, now a private dwelling)
- ◇ The Axe & Compass, Ogbourne St Andrew (sold by Stroud Brewery in 1924, became a sweet shop and private dwelling, later demolished, now the car park of the Silks on the Downs also now closed)
- ◇ 184 Winterbourne Monkton (Victor Spackman) (Beerhouse until 1948, then a private dwelling)
- ◇ The Royal Oak, Wootton Rivers
- ◇ Beerhouse at Berwick Bassett (Herbert James Rickards – baker, grocer, shopkeeper; actual house uncertain, adjacent to Berwick Home Farm)





The Brewery was on either side of the A4 (Bath to Marlborough) Road at West Kennett about 50-100meters to the east of The Avenue.

There is little evidence of it left, but the stables may have been converted into a row of cottages on the present lay-by.

Speaking with Tony Farthing of Avebury; who used to tenant farm the area to the north of the A4; there remain some buildings on the site, but they are in a sharp state of decay and are no longer being maintained by the current landowners.

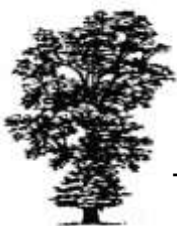

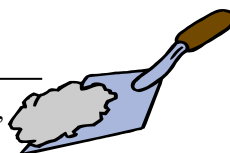
