A View from the Rectory

March(ing) Saints

David of Wales; Chad, Bishop of Lichfield; Perpetua, Felicity and their Companions; Martyrs at Carthage; Edward King, Bishop of Lincoln; Felix, Bishop, Apostle to the East Angles; Geoffrey Studdert Kennedy, Priest, Poet; Patrick of Ireland; Cyril, Bishop of Jerusalem, Teacher of the Faith; Joseph of Nazareth; Cuthbert, Bishop of Lindisfarne; Thomas Cranmer, Archbishop of Canterbury, Reformation Martyr; Walter Hilton of Thurgarton, Augustinian Canon, Mystic; Óscar Romero, Archbishop of San Salvador, Martyr; Harriet Monsell, Founder of the Community of St John the Baptist; and John Donne, Priest, Poet.

These are the feasts of saints remembered and celebrated in the month of March alone. I wonder how many you have heard of, and if so, what is it that you remember? The familiar ones are David, Patrick, Joseph, and possibly one or two others if you have a fondness for poetry (John Donne) or an interest in the Celtic saints (Cuthbert) or perhaps you remember 'Woodbine Willie', the nickname of Geoffrey Studdert-Kennedy. Ordinary people, all of them, who, moved by a spiritual experience of the presence and prompting of the divine, were enabled to go beyond the limitations of their lives and do extraordinary things for which they are still remembered. Driving snakes out of Ireland being perhaps a skill no longer required, but all of us might learn something of our own capacity for good, even while being far less than perfect, from reading of their lives and pondering their legacy.

Yet it doesn't just stop there, this March of the Saints, with these who have a whole day set aside for remembrance. Each of us have people who have left us a legacy of hope, trust and faith - a sign of something tangible beyond our understanding that has urged and inspired them to go beyond their human natures and show something of love. Perhaps it is a friend whose capacity to cope with pain or difficulty through being cheerful encouraged us to do the same when beset by issues? Perhaps it is someone who chose to embrace pain and befriend it? Or someone whose loss moved them to make the loss better for the next family to go through that trauma. Or perhaps it was a child whose smile lit a room and made the gloom flee before the giggles of glee watching bubbles float in the air, or kicking leaves along a woodland way.

Who in your life deserves a special day named after them, prayers written about them, or even a church dedicated to them? Think of them and set aside a bit of time to give thanks for them and if they be living, write to them and say how much their example has meant to you.

As the gifted singer/songwriter Talis Kimberley writes of an elderly lady living in our Benefice who shall remain nameless to spare her blushes:

I hold fast to the little things now; they keep me on my feet
A tune to learn, a cake to ice, a knitted something to complete
This the silent prayer I offer when I feel I cannot cope;
Gentle Saint of Bread and Butter... and knitting... lend me hope
Gentle Saint of Bread and Butter
And of things I can't explain
Lend me hope and grace and kindness
Bless the land and bless the grain.

My faith's a kind of patchwork; with it I am well content;
I believe that nothing's wasted where goodwill and love are spent;
When I'm feeling lost and aimless —
on a blue rock drifting nameless In the vast immensity of space...
Gentle Saint of Bread and Butter... Lend me grace.

Access to Bibles for clergy seems the most basic requirement for them to exercise their ministry. These will be purchased across the border in neighbouring Uganda.



NEWS FROM THE TOWER

Dave and I were reminiscing about our happy ringing days and the different methods there are, when we noticed that there is one called Baldrick Little Bob Doubles! There must be thousands of methods, some easy to ring and others difficult. One of the ancient ones has been rung for over 3 hundred years and it is still very popular. Methods are the bell ringing equivalent of music for instruments, and have to be learned and remembered. Avebury was always our 'home' tower but we also rang at Lyneham every week as well as other towers when we could. Ringers were always willing to ring for special occasions such as weddings if a tower was short.

The February Branch meeting was at Marlborough where they have a simulator so they can ring at any time and not be heard outside the church. This is an excellent thing for learners especially and also for practicing.

Brian Vickers wrote: Spring is now beginning to show the first signs of renewal. After a torrid Christmas season beset with much illness, late demands overriding bell ringing, the bell ringers are renewing their strength. Thus we had six ringers for the benefice service at Avebury on Sunday 12th February and on Tuesday 14th eleven ringers showed their love for the bells on practice night. For part of the time we rang all 8 bells. Not being too advanced a set of ringers, and not always having too many ringers, this is something we tend to leave to more expert visiting ringers.

News from the National Trust

This is the month where things start to liven up after winter. This year we go back to our summer opening hours on the 25 March (which includes opening the High Street toilets again). The restaurant is now open seven days a week, with the manor following suit shortly; a significant step that finally takes us back to pre-pandemic opening patterns.

In response to visitor feedback, we are trialling a new hourly based charging model in our main visitor car park from 25 March and will evaluate what impact this is having on visitor experience and income generation.

We currently still have erosion control restrictions in place in the henge, balancing public assess with care for the monument; this is monitored and regularly reviewed by our Rangers' team. Undertaking this now will help the monument to be more resilient later in the year.

Also, as part of our aims to make everyone feel welcome at Avebury, we have just completed resurfacing works of the Kitchen Garden at Avebury Manor, which makes this popular area of the garden much more accessible for all – and also looks beautiful Do have a look when you can.

The shop has always supported local producers and suppliers. This month, I thought that I would let you know about some of them.

Berkeley Farm Dairy -

Supply us with organic milk, cream and butter. They have a herd of Guernsey cows, and the butter is hand formed and wrapped in greaseproof paper in the traditional way and is a beautiful golden colour.





Brinkworth Cheeses – These include many unique local varieties such as Wiltshire Loaf (a traditional hard cheese), Avebury (a soft cheese), Royal Bassett Blue and Brinkworth blue. We also stock yoghurts.

Sumbler's Butchers – Lots of local meats including bacon, sausages, ham, as well as pies and pasties. Sumbler's originated in Avebury so you can't get much more local than that!


