LIGHT UP THE WORLD WITH PRAYER

Thy Kingdom Come 2021

A question I am often asked is this one - 'What is the point of prayer?'. It is just as often followed by the sentence 'I prayed and it didn't work'. We could write pages about the ensuing conversations, especially around the question of what is it we ask for and how prayers are answered but that is another matter. At the root of prayer is relationship: relationship with God, relationship with each other and relationship with neighbours, the world and creation, within which we may experience God at work if we learn to look and really see. The tradition of prayer is not exclusive, is open to everyone who connects with that something Other - that some of us find easier to name as God than others.

Christians believe that after the very first Ascension Day, when Jesus left the disciples, they gathered with Mary, his Mother, devoting themselves to prayer while they waited for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Like them, we believe the gift of the Holy Spirit is crucial in how we live our lives and how we build up relationships on our own we can do nothing. This is why through the centuries Christians have gathered at that time to pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit.

'Thy Kingdom Come' picks up this tradition. Over the past five years more and more worshipping communities have rediscovered the riches of this tradition and have dedicated the days between Ascension and Pentecost to pray 'Come Holy Spirit'. We are praying that the Spirit will light up our world at this time of pandemic and flow and flood through the world in all its needs, shining the bright light of Christ into every corner in need of healing, blowing away the cobwebs of our faith, refreshing and renewing us.

One Sunday, just after Easter, at the end of the service before the blessing, I was startled to see a beautiful butterfly land beside me and clamber onto my hand. When this happened in a church in Ireland, we felt it was an outwards visible sign of the presence of the Holy Spirit, bringing as it did joy, and the reminder of the continuity of new life emerging from the chrysalis. I could hear its wings beating, and the iridescent glow of its wings. In itself, by itself, it was the purest form of prayer- creation.

We need to emerge from the chrysalis of the pandemic ready to rediscover how to live life again, and hold fast to the community spirit, the relationships built and developed through service and care over these long months. Like the butterfly, lighting up our hearts and eyes that Sunday, we are invited to pray for the Holy Spirit to come and transform our world afresh.

Will you join us?

Between the 13th and 23rd of May there will be a range of prayer times, events, even a prayer journal to download and keep to remind you of where you see God at work in the world. Whether you are able to get out and about, or are still shielding at home, you can join in with this world prayer novena and Light up the World.

Thy Kingdom Come. What would this look like for you? Heaven on earth? what could be transformed? A deeper relationship with God and creation - what do you yearn to see happen?

Join in the prayer – and Light up Our World.

News from the Tower

As the rules about the safety of bell ringing haven't changed yet, I have been looking back at the old records. The following was in the Team News.

In a note appearing recently, in the Newsletter, on Richard Phelps, who cast the Avebury Tenor bell, the writer said, "It would be interesting to know the circumstances under which Richard Phelps cast this bell for the village of his birth". Some time ago, Miss E. Kemm, whose family had lived at the Manor for the greater part of the last century, came to give a talk to the W.I. about Avebury in Victorian times. Miss Kemm had many early records and she told this story. "John White, vicar of Avebury for 42 years at the end of the 17th century, was a very eccentric man. When a parishioner died, he rang bell no. 3, but if it was an important or rich person he rang the tenor. Unfortunately for the old parson, as he lay dying, the tenor became cracked so they had to ring the 3 for him. John White died in 1712. Richard Phelps is known to have visited Avebury from time to time to attend to his properties, it would seem therefore, that a few years after White's death, he had the bell taken to Whitechapel to be recast".

All of Avebury's eight bells were cast at Whitechapel. The old tenor bell is now the clock bell and the chiming bell for funerals etc. Richard Phelps was the Master at Whitechapel from 1700 – 1735. The foundry was the oldest business in the world until June, 2017 when it was sold.

AVEBURY PARISH COUNCIL

Headlines from Avebury Parish Council's online meeting on 6 April 2021

High Street: Huge thanks to the Paradise family whose members designed, constructed, and installed nine planters outside Manor Farm and for transferring the shrubs and other contents from the old planters – and for doing it over Easter Weekend! Thanks also to residents who have kindly come forward as 'planter custodians' and for generously undertaking to keep the planters in good order.

Road safety: We have submitted the petition to reduce the speed limit on the A4361 from 60mph to 40mph between Beckhampton and Avebury and northwards from Avebury. Thanks are due to our shops for helping us to reach 264 signatures – an impressive total, especially given reduced visitor numbers during lockdown – and to all who added theirs. Plans are being laid for the installation of the Speed Indicator Device or SID, which we hope to buy soon with APC funds and to which the Marlborough Area Board has made a 50% contribution.

Local issues: BT has confirmed that the telephone box at West Kennett layby is on its list for summer painting. A replacement mirror has been obtained and will be installed at a right-angle turn in Beckhampton. We continue to search for the owner of the concrete steps leading from the Waggon and Horses layby into Beckhampton since we would like to re-install the long-lost handrail.

The Ridgeway: Wiltshire Council has recently published its intention to extend the traffic restriction order currently in place for not more than eighteen months from 1 May. This will prohibit access to the relevant section to all motorised vehicles except motorbikes and farm and emergency vehicles. We agreed to join the Friends of the Ridgeway (subscription £15/year).

Summer Solstice: Anticipating that Wiltshire Council will provide the usual security arrangements and enforce parking restrictions, APC will manage a car parking scheme, for which arrangements will be announced as soon as possible. Please keep a beady eye on the noticeboards in Beckhampton, Trusloe, and West Kennett and at the community shop.

National Trust update: Jan explained that access to the Manor gardens was free of charge to all Avebury residents. She said that she welcomed feedback from the community on the Trust's Easter arrangements. Whilst there would be no camping or special arrangements for Beltane (1-2 May), Trust staff would be on site. The Trust was planning to have at least the usual security presence over the Summer Solstice. We thanked the Trust for scattering woodchip on a section of Kyter's Way to give a safer walking surface.

Dates of next meetings: an ordinary meeting on 4 May at 19h30 (online) and our Annual General Meeting on 18 May at 19h30 (probably in the Social Centre). As always, residents wishing to participate in these meetings are most welcome to do so.

Parish Defibrillators

The Parish Council is delighted that the last of 4 defibrillators in Kennet Valley Parish has been installed at St. Nicholas Church, Lower Fyfield.

3 defibrillators, essential for saving lives in our village communities were installed in September 2020 at:
Kennet Valley Hall in the front porch West Overton in the GPO telephone box next to the bus shelter
Lockeridge in the front porch of the Who'da Thought It pub

Location of the 4th defibrillator, destined for Fyfield posed a significant challenge. There was no ideal location in Fyfield: the bus shelter had no electrical supply the other locations kindly offered were too far from the village centre and vital seconds are crucial when a defibrillator is needed to save life in the event of cardiac arrest.

The most appropriate location was identified as the front porch of St Nicholas Church, Fyfield. But this posed its own challenges as the church is a Grade 2* listed building, of significant architectural merit, charming and serene.

How to preserve that centuries-old charm, yet deliver a critical, life-saving service to the villagers?

Kennet Valley Parish Council collaborated with the Fyfield, West

Overton and East Kennett Parochial Church Council (the PCC) to solve this challenge, sensitively and pragmatically. The PCC has approved the installation in October, but to strict criteria and guidelines, to entirely uphold the character and innate quality of the church.

An application was approved by the Archdeacon of Salisbury on 3rd March and the defibrillator was installed on 30th March out of direct sight, under the existing, restored, reconditioned bench within the porch. This will ensure the church remains the ancient treasure it has always been within our beloved community.

Kennet Valley Parish Council has funded the reconditioning, restoration, repainting and reinforcement of the church benches and is most thankful to Chris Flood for his superb work.

The Defibrillators require a brief daily status check. The Council is currently seeking volunteers to carry out the checks on the newly installed defibrillator at Fyfield, please contact the Parish Clerk on 01672 861262 or email parishclerk.fyfield@gmail.com if you are willing to assist.

Parish Council Elections

These will not take place on 6 May 2021 as the election is uncontested. The number of candidates validly standing is equal to or less than the number of vacant seats and therefore all candidates are duly elected.

Lockeridge High Street

It is currently necessary for St John's School to use a 70-seat vehicle on the school bus route due to Covid 19 social distancing requirements, this makes it difficult for the bus when turning from Lockeridge High Street into West Overton Road, most notably when cars are parked in the vicinity of the junction. The Parish Council has been informed by the bus company that on 2 occasions during the first week of last term minor damage was caused to the bus when attempting to make the turn. In response we are seeking the assistance of Lockeridge residents, parents of children at St Johns and Kennet Valley School to help alleviate the problem. We would like to politely request no parking on the white line at this location at any time. Kennet Valley School has also been contacted on this matter and they will be reminding parents to depart promptly following the 3.10pm school pick up and a notification has gone out to St Johns from Wiltshire Transport. We do understand how difficult it can be to park in the village, especially during

Ofsted 'Good school' April 2021

It was lovely to start term 5 in the bright sunshine after everyone had a happy and safe holiday.

Curriculum

This term we started our three topic blocks with Science for three weeks. Throughout the school children and staff have been looking at Living Things, Habitats and Humans. There has been much planting going on, walks around the local area and investigations into the human body and bodies of other animals.

Children have been inspired by this topic and the warmer weather at the start of the term certainly helped when we were planting seeds and making cuttings of different plants.

A year 4 child said, "It has been great to find out more about how plants and animals grow and change throughout their lifetimes", with another remarking "I loved dissecting the daffodils and tulips in class to find the different parts of the plant".

Year 1 and Reception started their science blocks by investigating the local area more, going on several walks to West Woods and around Lockeridge. Staff took fantastic pictures of them on these walks, which they were able to share with parents via our Seesaw app. Two Year 1 children shared their thoughts about their walks – "It was good fun and very exciting" and "I liked seeing all the trees in the woods".

As we move into May, we will be having a Modern Foreign Language Block and an Art Block, which all the staff are looking forward to teaching.

PE

At the start of Term 5, the whole school returned to the Kennet Valley Hall for PE on a Wednesday. It was fantastic to see the children playing such a wide variety of sports again. Staff also love going again, as it means that they are able to teach all the children across the school on a Wednesday. This has always been one of the things that helps with the 'Family Feel' to our wonderful small school.

Year 5 and 6 were also delighted to start Fencing in term 5. They have a weekly session of 1 and ½ hours of Fencing with a trained coach and are working towards an award of BFA Grade 1. After just one session a year 6 child said "Fencing was good because the coach taught us new moves and positions", while another said "It was great that we got to try the new things we had been taught". The Year 5 children joined in, adding that the fencing sessions were fun and it was "Good to experience this new skill while using all the equipment".

While the Year 5 and 6 children were learning all about fencing, the year 2, 3 and 4 children were have gymnastic sessions with our coach Jeremy from PH Sports. They started off using floor mats but then went on to use more equipment such as boxes and the wall bars. Children commented, "It was really exciting to learn new positions and poses", and "I liked that we were working on creating our own gymnastic sequences".

We have also restarted our after school sports clubs. These were multi-skills for the younger children and cricket for the older children.

Playground Update

During the Easter holidays we held a community consultation meeting to show off our plans for our playground refurbishment. We talked to those joining the meeting about the equipment that we are planning to put into the site, once the old play equipment has been taken away. We will also be moving the cars to a more suitable position and adding a pedestrian gateway.

As a school, we started this project several years ago, and it is down to the hard work of our Friends Association and the incredibly kind donations from our parents and community that has allowed us to get to this exciting point. We are hoping that the site will be cleaned and the new equipment will be added in the summer holidays, ready for our return to school in September. I would like to take this opportunity to say a HUGE THANK YOU to all that have helped with the project so far.




