# A View from the Rectory

May is the traditional month when spring finally arrives and the hedgerows burst forth in blossom. As a child I loved the hawthorn, also called 'The May' and a song of my youth celebrates Mary, Mother of Christ - 'O Mary, we crown thee with blossom this day, Queen of the Angels and Queen of The May' – Queen of the healing hawthorn, not the month. Early leaves of the tree taste like nutty bread, late berries nourish birds and small mammals, and autumn foragers can also use the haws to make gin, jelly and even ketchup. May - the promise of a new spring, a fertile harvest and plenty in store for the winter.

As we begin this fifth month of 2023 we see the crowning not of a Queen but a King - Charles - the third of his name to rule this land. I found myself thinking of how the word 'may' is used as an invocation and invitation for God's presence or blessing to come upon someone. A common format of blessing in Ireland (in *Gaelige* of course) begins 'May you be in heaven half an hour before the Devil knows you're dead' and perhaps one of the most familiar of Irish blessings being 'May the road rise to meet you...'

What would be our invocation prayer for the new King of the May as he is crowned not with the Hawthorn of the Healing but the weight of responsibility for his people, God's people, of this and other shores. A solemn undertaking, an awe-filled commitment, a life-long promise before God.

Perhaps this might suffice as a May Blessing for our new monarch:

May the love of Christ equip you for the demands of this calling;

May the peace of Christ dwell in your workplace and your home;

May the humbleness of shepherds mark your service to this nation,

Its diversity of people that call this land their 'home'.

May your reign be marked with peacekeeping, and stewardship of creation,

Proper use of power and defending those in need,

The welcome of the stranger, sanctuary instead of danger,

A place of loving kindness for lost and lonely souls

May your faith in God sustain you and protect you from each sorrow,

And the Christ that bids you welcome to the Feast of End of Days.

Bring you joy and solace, bless your given length of days.

And when you reach the gates eternal, may you find all those who love you,

# For Whom the Bell Tolls?

Please don't be alarmed if you hear the bells ring out from the Bell tower of St Michael and All Angels, West Overton in the coming weeks.

## News from the Tower

Ringing in March and April has been marked by good attendances at practices and at Church. We had 7 ringers for the monthly service at Avebury. In a time honoured tradition most bells are not rung in Holy Week, whilst there are no services to ring for. The one exception is Good Friday where for many years the old tenor bell has been tolled, (this year by Brian Vickers) for the annual Walk of Witness. Tolling a bell is usually done by striking a bell which is fixed in its mounting, rather than swung on a wheel. At Avebury, ringing the old tenor bell (cast in 1719) which is much heavier (weighing nearly a ton) than the bells on wheels for change ringing. It's weight gives a much deeper tone. Since 1980 this bell has been tolled to mark this solemn walk.

It was sad to hear of the death of Gretchen Rawlings. Vanda Rawlings requested that the bells be rung before her mother's funeral. Local ringers were Michele Lomas, Jonathan Stubbs and Brian Vickers, while thanks are due to Andy and Kathryn Miller plus Martin Strange for coming from Calne to help us. We concentrated on trying to ring simple sound patterns well, as we do for service rings. Vanda seemed very pleased with our ringing. Brian Vickers

#### **AVEBURY & DISTRICT WI**

April is our AGM month so we started with our usual meeting, then went into the AGM with reports on the year from our secretary and from yours truly, before finishing the business part of the meeting and moving on to our speaker.

We welcomed local historian Nick Baxter who gave us a very interesting and entertaining talk on James Townsend who was thought to be the first MP and Lord Mayor of London of African heritage. His Grandmother was the daughter of an African woman and a Dutch soldier, who were married in what is now West Africa. James's grandfather, James Phipps, was from a prominent family of clothiers in Westbury. His mother, Phipps's daughter, married his father clandestinely in the Fleet prison (a debtors prison like the Marshalsea) but it is not thought that his African origins were common knowledge at the time. He married an heiress and was able to enter politics supported by Earl of Shelburne, becoming MP for West Looe and later an alderman of the City of London. He was very active in the politics of the time and was elected Lord Mayor of London in 1772 in controversial circumstances. He later became MP for Calne with the support of Earl of Shelburne. He died in reduced circumstances in 1787.

Our next meeting is Resolutions, not often well supported! We will be theming this meeting around the Coronation of King Charles Ill which will have taken place a few days before and there will be a fish and chip supper, a royal quiz and cake!

### **Dying Matters Awareness Week** from 8-14 May 2023

Dying Matters Awareness Week takes place this year from 8 to 14 May, led by Hospice UK's Dying Matters campaign. Throughout the week, people across the country will come together to encourage communities to get talking about death, dying, and grief. The theme of Dying Matters Awareness Week 2023 is 'Dying Matters at work'.

At Prospect Hospice, there will be an interactive display in the Heart of the Hospice cafe which everyone is welcome to contribute to. The display will ask different questions on the topic of death and dying, such as 'What do you want people to wear to your funeral?', encouraging us all to think and talk about death, and helping to break the taboo that surrounds it. 
