A View from the Rectory

I don't usually start with words of scripture; however, after the events of the last months, the escalating violence between the beloved communities of the Holy Land, the relentless war in Ukraine, the violence of flood, earthquake and unsettled October weather in the season of Remembrance, I do so now. St Paul in a letter to a disturbed community in Ancient Greece writes of a radically different approach to conflict and change:

Ephesians 6:13-15. Put on the armour of God, that you may be able to resist on the evil day and, having done everything, to hold your ground. So stand firm, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, and the breastplate of righteousness in place, and your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace.

It's interesting that in this letter to the Ephesians, St Paul puts peace in the context of war, and also that he places this bit of armour on our feet. Surely we think of peace as the opposite of war, belonging not on our feet so much as in our hearts, and being made of stillness, prayer and gentleness, rather than action. But Paul gives us a different 'take': peace is feet on the ground, which steadies us and, paradoxically, gives our feet wings. The thing about this sort of peace, deep peace, faith-based peace, is that it prepares us for action. For Jesus, peace - shalom in Hebrew - was not so much the absence of struggle but the **presence of love**. For Gandhi Jesus' sacrifice was viewed thus: "A man who was completely innocent, offered himself as a sacrifice for the good of others, including his enemies, and became the ransom of the world. It was a perfect act."

In today's battles, as we remember those who gave and still give their lives to preserve the peace and lives of others, perhaps we who sit watching with horror the unfolding violence and bloodshed might be drawn to think of Christ's armour. He opened his arms with love upon the cross to put an end to violence and war - yet we never learn, and greed and power and injustice all lead to the need for men and women to die on battlefields.

What was it that kept Jesus walking on the journey to the cross? Love - the shoes he wore that made him ready were shoes of love. What if we this Remembrance-tide unilaterally disarm from whatever conflict we are caught in, and put on an armour that makes us ready for action that runs counter to the impulse to lash out? What if we just stop our petty bickering and toddler-tantrums - 'I want my own way'? Just stop and take off the 'bovver boots' and put on the Shoes of Peace? Small drops become a flood - and the world needs flooding with peace.

Upper Kennet Churches United PCC

On the 1st of November the 5 parishes of the Upper Kennet will unite in law to create a new parish which shall be named "The Parish of Upper Kennet". As you will know, this has been a very long process, begun before I became Rector over 12 years ago. As we begin a new chapter in the history of the Benefice I would like to pay tribute to the diligence of the Working Group for giving 6 years of their lives to discerning whether this is the right way to go for our churches and communities: Penny Gold, Anghared Hughes, Simon Jones, Lizzie Daley, Robert Fitzpatrick and Peter Barry (current) and Martin Knight who preceded Peter Barry. When consultations took place only two formal objections against the proposal were made to the Church Commissioners, and there were no appeals to the Commissioners' decision to support the proposals. I would also like to pay tribute to all those who served on the Benefice Council, especially our outgoing Lay Chair, Mark Wightman, and PCCs over the past decades – the Lord knows all you have done and I pray you are Blessed as you deserve, by our Loving God.

What does this mean for you? Actually, very little will change on the ground. There will still be a Rector and Ministry Team and Churchwardens for each church. A single PCC, with oversight for the running of the new Parish, will replace the (5) individual PCCs and Benefice Council. St Nicholas Fyfield remains a Chapel of Ease. The current individual PCCs will become Local Church Committees, and everyone on our current PCCs has indicated their willingness to remain in post. Church services and all that we do remains unchanged, the wonderful admin team at the Office continue as normal. If you give money in support of your local village church this continues too - over seen by our team of treasurers (bank accounts will remain unchanged for the immediate future). Safeguarding officers and the requirements of all in official roles to undergo training is unchanged. All our current churchwardens have indicated their willingness to continue in post for consistency and continuity and therefore will be standing for re-election PCC members remain Trustees and must be baptised communicant regular attenders at church, however Local Church Committees will have an opportunity to invite those with skills and time to join the committee and help us keep the churches serving the community. Each active church of the former parish will have a Local Church Committee. If this interests you please speak to Rev Maria or your Church Wardens.

The process will begin with: A Parish Meeting on Wednesday 15th November at 7.30pm at St James' Church, Avebury

The purpose of the meeting will be:

- 1. To elect the churchwardens.
- 2. To establish the new PCC (this is similar to an Annual Parochial Church Meeting or APCM) by electing Lay Representatives and Deanery Synod Members.
- 3. As the Inaugural meeting of the New PCC, to elect officers and set a date for the first formal meeting. Churchwardens are elected by 1) Anyone on the church electoral rolls 2) anyone on the UK Government electoral role by nominations

PCC members are elected only by those on the church electoral rolls



Preparing for the winter

Parish Council grant from Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks (SSEN)

The Parish Council is pleased to report that it has been successful in securing a grant from SSEN to help with our winter emergency preparations. The grant will enable the Parish Council's Emergency Team to buy a stock of space blankets and other equipment to be used in the event of an emergency.

Surface water flooding

Surface water flooding can happen very quickly and local residents are encouraged to report instances of standing water on high speed roads (60mph) or gullies that if blocked would cause internal property flooding by using the Wiltshire App. http://www.wiltshire.gov.uk/mywiltshire-download

It is also possible to sign up for flood and groundwater warnings https://www.gov.uk/sign-up-for-flood-warnings. Other useful contact details include the Floodline telephone: 0345 988 1188 (24-hour service).

Traffic speed and noise on the A4.

Following several complaints from local residents about traffic speeds and noise from cars and motorcycles the Parish Council has collaborated again with neighbouring Parishes to request additional police surveillance on the A4. Road safety remains a major concern especially following the sad news of the fatal accident near West Kennett on 29th May 2023 and other accidents on the A4.

Lockeridge Community Speedwatch Team

The Lockeridge Community Speedwatch Team of volunteers began its work in July 2021 and is supported by the Wiltshire Police Speed Enforcement Officers who have patrolled in the area too.

However recent Police statistics show that at least 11% of drivers continue to exceed the 20mph speed limit through the village. Consequently, a fund raising campaign for a speed indicator device has begun and initial grants have been secured from the Parish Council and the Marlborough Area Board. Further details will follow.

Please remember that less speeding makes our roads safer and if a car travelling at **35** mph hits a pedestrian there is a **50%** chance they will be killed,

at **30mph** there is **20%** chance they will be killed.

at **20 mph** there is a **2.5%** chance they will be killed.

Loud Fireworks Frighten Animals!

For many people fireworks are lots of fun, but to animals they are terrifying, loud and can cause great distress. Every year thousands of animals are sedated after being frightened by fireworks. Others are so distraught they bolt and get lost or injured.

Attend a public firework display instead of holding your own party. These events are organised by skilled people for the community. They are well publicised and give warning to residents and local farmers to take steps to safeguard their animals during a specific time period.

Keep cats and dogs indoors at night.

Organise any walks for your dog during daylight hours. Ensure they are wearing an identification tag and have been microchipped, so that your animal is returned to you if it escapes and becomes lost or is injured. Once fireworks start close all windows, curtains, switch on music or television and let them take refuge in the corner of a room or under the sofa if they wish to hide.

Try not to comfort your pets if they get frightened, this will only reassure them that there is something to be worried about. Try to remain calm and relaxed, your pets will pick up on this. Small creatures such as rabbits or guinea pigs. If they live outside should be brought into an outhouse or garden shed for extra protection during times of fireworks. Give them extra bedding so they can burrow in and feel safe.

Horses, ponies and donkeys.

Know in advance - check to see if there are going to be any firework displays in your area.

Talk to the organisers - where possible, explain there are horses nearby and ask them to set off their fireworks in the opposite direction.

Don't forget wild animals. Bonfires should be built as late as possible to reduce the risk of hedgehogs or other small creatures crawling in to sleep. Disturbing a bonfire's foundations before lighting ensures any wildlife has a chance to escape.

Clearing up. Make sure that all litter from a fireworks party is picked up and disposed of safely as this is hazardous to both domestic and wild animals.

Finally ... Remember, remember- never let off fireworks near animals.
