A View from the Pew

Harvest confusion

The sound of heavy machinery running through the night, huge monsters with lights creeping across the fields in pitch darkness, and the roar of mighty tractors with trailers driving through our small country lanes scattering straw like confetti signal that it's harvest time. The flattened fields will soon turn brown when ploughed, and another season will have passed.

I am reminded of the 1950s when a friend and I used to go down to a farm in Devon to help during harvest. (I use the term 'help' loosely.) It was supposed to be a holiday but it was very hard work in the fields gathering in the small bales. On one occasion in the early evening as we stacked a final load, we persuaded the reluctant farmer to let us drive the tractor and its heavy load across the fields to the road. His reluctance was justified. We started with an almighty jolt resulting in the whole load toppling to the ground – and another two hours of work to reload!

The previous day we had helped drive a large flock of sheep along the A361 to another field. My shouting at them not only brought them to an almost permanent halt but did likewise to several hundred cars!

As we decorate our churches for harvest festival, I remain conscious of the stocks of produce in our supermarkets - beans from Kenya and Peru, broccoli spears from Spain, onions and peppers from Holland - and the effect on global warming for such transportation.

So, as I offer a prayer of thanks to God for 'our' harvest should I also pray about saving the world in other respects?

A glass of water on the altar perhaps to remind us of our dwindling water resources; a piece of coal to thank God for heating - no, not coal, perhaps a can of oil - no, perhaps a model of a wind turbine or nuclear reactor; no? then perhaps a battery for an electric car with its relatively scarce metals mined from a third world country, or from China.

No, maybe we should just have a sheaf of locally grown corn in the entrance to the church at East Kennett as we used to many moons ago!

Perhaps I might get some answers when I go to Marlborough College for the *U3a in Kennet* special interest day lectures on Climate Change and Sustainable Futures.

I will of course be offering prayers to thank God for our sustenance and our world generally but I clearly also need to pray and humbly ask for guidance.

Food for thought.

It was a busy day at the hatch with customers flowing in throughout the day. We managed to raise, after expenses, nearly £1300 for Monkton Church – a new record. Thanks, as ever, to all those involved in the success of the day – hard work and good humour in equal amounts!

We again fielded a large team of cyclists for the Ride and Stride on 11 September – some 10 people of all ages, under the leadership of Mark and Rob. They completed a ride around the Deanery, over 50 miles, which features a number of long hills.

The weather was kind, not too hot, not wet and not windy! Thanks to all those who took part. We hope they will have raised several hundred pounds for Wiltshire Historic Churches Trust and Monkton church.



Avebury Parish Council

Headlines from Avebury Parish Council's meeting on 7 September 2021

A member of the public asked why the footpath to Rawlins Park was so poorly maintained. We replied that the parish steward had been asked to strim it. The National Trust has also been invited to address any overgrowth on the land it manages that is close to the footpath.

An application to fell two sycamores at Ashcroft was approved. The applicant told us that replacement trees were planned.

We accepted a tender from Ringway, Wiltshire Council's contractor. Ringway will set the foundations for two sockets. The sockets will be used to install a Speed Indicator Device (SID) on a pole and will allow the pole and the SID to be moved from one location (the Rawlins Park bus shelter for southbound traffic) to the other (the main car park entrance for vehicles driving eastward). The SID will remind drivers of the speed limit. It will also provide data to inform future discussion about vehicle speeds. We await a date for these works.

Wiltshire Council's consultation period on the proposed speed limit reduction from 60mph to 50mph on the A4361 has ended. We heard that objections had been received (mainly, we understand, from those wanting a lower speed limit). The issue needs now to be considered and decided by Wiltshire councillors.

We heard that at least six organisations had expressed some interest in exhibiting in the proposed community exhibition space in the chapel and that there would be a meeting for them in October.

BT has been asked to clean the recently repainted telephone box (emergency calls only) at West Kennett and to replace a missing acrylic pane.

On the initiative of Broad Hinton and Winterbourne Bassett PC, we agreed to discuss at our next meeting how to work with other stakeholders with the aim of improving flood management.

Dates of next meetings: an ordinary meeting on 5 October at 19h30 in the Social Centre. As always, residents wishing to participate in these meetings are most welcome to do so.

September 2021

For our first 'face to face' meeting in a year a small group of members and guests gathered in the Social Centre on 9th September for a talk by Gordon Brockman on silver marks. He covered the main identifying marks, how to recognize them and how to establish when your piece was made. He also told us about the rarer marks from Assay Offices that are no longer working. Members brought items for him to examine and value and these were used to good effect to illustrate his talk, establishing the year and maker as well. He also educated us about caring for our silver items – never use liquid silver polish but instead wash each item in hot soapy water then buff with a silver cloth. Gordon is a great raconteur and regaled us with stories of finds, including his 'find of a lifetime' – a pair of rare Georgian candlesticks which you may remember hearing about in the news earlier this year. We're hoping to invite Gordon back to do an 'Antiques Roadshow' valuation session at some point in the future so watch this space.

Our next meeting will be on 14th October and is 'Handbags – a historical journey'; members are invited to bring an old handbag for the competition and/or an autumn hedgerow arrangement for the floral competition. Programme cards will be available at the meeting for those who have not received them.

David Scattergood

President, Avebury Cricket Club 2002-2021

Many of you will already have learned of the sad passing of Dave Scattergood, who died at home on 25 August 2021.

Dave will always be remembered across this community as someone who really made things happen - naturally fun-loving, always with time for others, and invariably excited by any opportunity to be involved in projects to bring our community closer together and have fun.

He was an instrumental part of the team that developed the Avebury Community Shop, which celebrated its 12^{th} anniversary this year. I'm told the process to set up the shop was complex to say the least – and it is testament to his unswerving enthusiasm, as well as his often unconventional fund-raising techniques (the shop can boast shareholders up and down the country!) that it was ultimately able to launch and to grow into the success that it is today.

He was a compulsive fund-raiser, and will be well known for almost singlehandedly running a series of auctions of promises at the Avebury Club in the 1990s and 2000s, which not only generated funds for a number of deserving local causes, but generated a lot of laughs as well.

But it's as the founding father of the current iteration of Avebury Cricket Club that we will remember him most. As long ago as 1989, a chance discussion with a few other village residents, led enthusiastically by Dave, resulted in the reformation of Avebury C.C., re-kindling a club that had played on the sports field at Avebury since just after the First World War, having its origins in the workforce of Alexander Keiller.

What Dave re-started in those days, as a small group of locals playing on the field on Sunday afternoons, has become an open-access community club with players as young as 5 and as old as 85; and with nearly 200 registered junior members in 2021. Whilst this growth is admirable, it would be worthless if we didn't try to stay true to the principles on which Dave founded the club: open to everyone, serving the community, raising money where we can, having fun on the field and having more fun off the field if we can possibly get away with it. And of course, setting a standard in the excellence of its cricket teas to which others aspire!

On Saturday 28th August 2021, we played our final 1st XI league match of the season in the West of England Premier League. Both teams stood in lines on the square, in glorious sunshine, and observed a minute's silence at the beginning of the game in Dave's memory. We had a wonderful match against a powerful Swindon C.C. 1st XI, and against the odds came away with a famous victory.

I'd like to think he had something to do with that.

Well played, Dave – a jolly fine innings. You live on in everything you helped to

He worked tirelessly in the preparations for the shop opening, which were complex to say the least. He organised builders, assembled shelving, made agreements with suppliers, fetched stock from the Cash and Carry in Swindon and carried out 1001 other tasks. He used all his contacts to ensure that the shop opening was a success, and was great at persuading people to help in getting the job done. He even managed to get the Sunday Times to report on our opening (the picture is from the Sunday Times article and shows him outside the shop on opening day).

He continued to offer valuable advice and suggestions throughout the last 13 years - until very recently. Dave will be sorely missed, not just by the shop but by the wider community to which he contributed so much.

Because the shop is so small and ventilation is limited, we will be continuing to ask customers to observe the current precautions. We will be continuing to limit numbers in the shop to 2 people or small family groups, and also asking customers to continue to wear face masks in the shop.

News from September 2021

Welcome Back!

Hello again from Kennet Valley school. We have returned to school this month after our summer break, and I am pleased to report that school feels more 'normal' than it has over the last 18 months. We no longer have to have bubbles in the school, so all of our children have been having playtimes and lunchtime together again. It has been delightful to see our older children getting to know our new reception and caring for them so well.

Reception

This year we were delighted to welcome 9 new reception children to Wrens class. Mrs. McQue and Mrs. Alexander were very excited to meet them again on the first day. These children have joined the Reception / Year 1 class and will complete most of their learning through 'Continous Provision', as well as having daily phonic lessons. This allows them to learn through planned and self-chosen play tasks. They also have weekly challenges to complete in the different areas of the classroom.

Buddies

As with previous years our new reception children have all got a buddy in year 6. These buddies will make sure that they are ok in the playground, will read with them during the week and help them during the school day. Being a buddy at kennet Valley is a very important role and I know that the Year 6 children will work hard to be fantastic role models to the younger children.

New Children

As well as our 9 new reception children, we have also welcomed 9 children into years 1-5. I know that I speak for all of the staff team when I say that we hope that they are enjoying school and feel happy and safe with us.

Curriculum

As you will know, from reading past articles, we plan and teach in blocks at Kennet Valley. This allows children to immerse themselves in one subject over several weeks and to build their knowledge. We have started the year by having a science block throughout the school. Classes have been looking at States of Matter and changes in materials. We have found out about non-Newtonian liquids, found out the best materials for different activities, looked at reversible and irreversible changes,

and looked at how particles move within solids, liquids, and gases. From Monday 20^{th} September the school moved on to a history block. During this block the classes will be learning and researching more about a range of history topics – all which are linked to our Value of the term, which is Courage.

With the school year comes new enrichments opportunities for our children. Over the coming weeks all the children will take part in visiting a Science Dome. Wrens class will be going on a school trip to science centre, while our Year 6 children go on a day trip adventure. The Year 5 and 6 children have the opportunity to hear a published author talk as part of the Marlborough Literature Festival. Finally, later in the autumn our Year 4 children will be setting off for their residential trip. I will, of course, keep you all updated about how these activities and trip go – I hope you enjoy reading about them as much as the children enjoy doing them.

Little Angels and Kennet Valley

Toddlers

We are really pleased to announce that the two parent and toddlers' groups, that use our school hall, have restarted this month. These groups (Little Angels and Kennet Valley Toddlers) take turns to use the space on Fridays. It was wonderful to see so many young families in the school over the last few weeks and I hope that they all continue to come for a play.

School Council

At the start of the year, we always vote for the new members of the School Council. This group work with Mrs. Hues and Mrs. Bushnell to plan and organise a range of activities throughout the year. In the past this has included fund raising events for the school, stalls at the Christmas or Summer fayres and raising money for a range of charities. I know that Mrs. Hues and Mrs. Bushnell are looking forward to working with this year's School Council members.

Friends' Association, Coffee with the Governors and a School Social!

On Thursday 16th September, we had a school social. This was planned in coordination with the Governing Body and with our Friends Association. We wanted to give our parents an opportunity to meet with us in a more social setting than at a school meeting or parents evening. We were blessed with good weather, and I was very pleased to see so many people. Governors will be following this meeting with a Coffee Morning for parents on Monday 18th October – all parents are invited to come and have a cup of tea or coffee and a breakfast pastry with Governors from 8.50am.

Our Friends Association have continued

to support the school. Early in the term they held a camping and BBQ night and raised over £1800.00 for the school. I am so grateful to all that helped and supported this event.

They will be holding their AGB on Thursday 14th October and I know that they are keen to get to know new members to the group, as well as welcoming back parents who have supported the committee before.

Stay and Play

As we move into the new school year, we are very pleased to be able to re-start our Stay and Play sessions. These are sessions that allow parents and children (aged 2,3,4 years old) to come into the school and find out more about us. The children are invited to play in Wrens class with the current reception and year 1 children, while their parents and carers can have a drink and cake with some members of our parent body. National Lottery awards Kennet Valley Hall £10,000 for new ventilation system

Kennet Valley Village Hall has been awarded a grant of £10,000 by the National Lottery Community Fund to install an innovative ventilation system.

The installation is designed to reassure residents who may be worried about returning to crowded events after the Covid pandemic. The system will be installed during the October Half Term to reduce the inconvenience to regular hall users.

The state of the art system will carefully monitor air quality in the hall and maintain good ventilation without losing heat. The Heat Exchanger 'at heart of the system' uses sensors to control the rate of air change. The sensor detects CO2 in the outgoing air and then increases the incoming air flow in response. The system will also incorporate an Air Source Heat Pump which will provide a supplementary heat source should the need arise

A Parish Council spokesman said: "Given the anxiety about transmission that is going to linger for a very long while to come, there will be serious issues about ventilation, especially with the hirers, so the plan ticks many boxes."



The total cost of the system will be circa £20K. The Hall Trustees will pay half from the Hall's own Reserves and are most grateful to the National Lottery Community Fund for their Award, without which the project would not have been possible.

Living with Monuments Project

The Living with Monuments Project summer excavation took place from the end of July through to mid-August 2021 in the Avebury half of the WHS. The site - the West Kennet palisade enclosures - is full of interesting and complex archaeology, and the main trench contained many features such as post holes, pits and ditches. Some of these features were constructed later than others and so had cut into the earlier features. Several antlers were found which will hopefully help to date some of these features, and there was also some worked flint and a small amount of pottery. The post-excavation analysis will reveal more as the data is processed and this will aid interpretation of the site. We will let you know when the report is released, and hope to be able to organise some talks about the project in due course. 
