# A View from the Rectory

I am often asked why it matters to come to church when you can pray at home. My response is usually along the lines of 'how would it feel to be a mountain climber and never climb with others and know the feeling of trusting, belonging and being part of something bigger than you?' Or 'remember during Covid how excited we were to be able to gather together again as family, outside churches for services and just to have a cuppa face to face'.

In his book 'The Cost of Discipleship', the German priest Dietrich Bonhoeffer begins with the question "In the last resort, what we want to know is not what would this or that person, or this or that Church, have of us, but what Jesus Christ himself wants for, and of, us."

I know my faith is not one that shields me from pain, distress or need, but it is one that helps me make sense of them. I have found that both praying alone with the God I know is there (somehow!), and trust with the direction of my life (with a few 'REALLY, God?', moments), or gathering with others so we can experience this together, life becomes more purposeful, more focused and more fulfilled. Most emphatically it doesn't become easier, just easier to live through and make sense of.

Bonhoeffer paid the ultimate price in Germany as he resisted the Nazi dictatorship, particularly in the persecution of Jews. He was executed two weeks before the end of the war in 1945. We hear today, in the news reports, of the persecution, displacement and destruction of communities across the world – these reports are not about unnamed strangers to us that we can simply say 'how sad', but of brothers and sisters, some of whom share my faith in Jesus, all of whom matter to the God I love and serve.

When we belong to a local church, and find a loving faith community, we can enjoy the comfort of our worship with others on a pilgrim journey home to God. But we should never lose sight of the fact that to be joined in our faith to Jesus is to join us with every other Christian worldwide AND all of creation, all its peoples and all its woes. So 'why come to church when I can pray at home? - because we are invited to find the peace of God in the personal, local and global contexts we face and in the company of others.

# Update on the Marlborough Deanery partnership with the Diocese of Morobo

A highlight for the Diocese of Morobo was the **distribution of Bibles** to members of the clergy on August 11<sup>th</sup>. Now for the first time they have their own copy of the Bible, plus some hymn books and prayer books. They are most grateful for the money raised in our Deanery to enable this to happen.



Meanwhile, some hard work has been done on the **agricultural project**, with maize, beans, cassava and coffee all doing well, and more groundnuts to be planted soon. There is a need for wellington boots for those working in the fields, and we will be able to purchase 20 pairs from our general fund.



Transport for clergy is an ever-pressing concern. Bishop Data (having lost his car in the ambush in June) now has a motor-bike, but most of the clergy have to share just a couple of bicycles. We have enough funds in the bank to provide 10 more bicycles, and we are looking to raise money for another 10. Keep an eye out for an appeal this autumn.

**Bishop Data**'s vestments were stolen by his assailants in June, and he feels he needs replacements in order to carry out his formal duties effectively. Some spare robes have been donated in the Salisbury Diocese, and we are hoping that they can be sent out to him soon. He is in good heart, and he asks that we continue to pray for God's work in Morobo.

## **News from the Tower**

At Avebury things have been relatively quiet over the past month with sundry ringers being on holiday. On  $22^{nd}$  August only 6 ringers turned up for the Tuesday evening practice. Our main problem, however, is getting enough ringers for the monthly Benefice service at Avebury because some ringers, who live further away, will be ringing at their own churches. At one point (with the Tye family away on holiday) it looked as if we would only have 2 ringers for the service at Avebury on the  $10^{th}$  September. Happily the Tye's returned with the twins James and Samuel and their dad Sean making 5 then Stephen Andre arrived to make a  $6^{th}$  ringer, and all ended happily.

After years of fund raising Calne has completed their plan to have 10 bells. Finally the original 8 bells were taken to a bell foundry in order to enable them to be tuned with the 2 new bells. They can now ring the front 6, the back 8 or all ten. The new treble was donated by the Salisbury Diocesan Guild of Ringers in memory of all SDGR ringers who died during the wars. The second was donated by the Keltek Trust in celebration of Queen Elizabeth II platinum jubilee. On Sunday, 10<sup>th</sup> September, the Bishop of Ramsbury rededicated the bells. The church was packed and included senior members of the Guild. Calne is the only church to have 10 bells in the branch.

## MONKTON CHURCH AUGUST/SEPTEMBER FUND RAISING

After a very successful first Teas in Avebury Social Centre we held our second one on August Bank Holiday Monday. Based in the excellent Avebury Social Centre we were able to provide a comfortable venue for customers with a wide choice of savouries soup, sausage rolls, quiche etc and a vast array of superb cakes generously donated by village members from Monkton and Berwick Bassett. It was a busy day with customers flowing in throughout the day. We were grateful for the support from our



local friends as well as the tourists. Ziggie the Owl played a great role in engaging with the public, raising money for being stroked and directing customers to our venue! We managed to raise, after expenses, over £1,420 for Monkton Church – a new record – which, added to our takings on the first event, has cleared over £2,200. Thanks, as ever, to all those involved in the success of the days – hard work and good humour in equal amounts!

We again fielded a large team of cyclists for the Ride and Stride on 9 September – some 13 people of all ages, under the leadership of Mark. They completed a ride around the Deanery, over 50 miles, which features a number of long hills. The weather was hot, oh so hot! Tom did a great job of being there with the backup vehicle with ice, cold towels etc. Thanks to all those who took part. They will have raised several hundred pounds for Wiltshire Historic Churches Trust and Monkton church (final amount yet to be counted!).

# **Avebury Parish Council**

A number of issues were raised by members of the public at our September meeting:

High kerbstones in Avebury Trusloe: it was stated that the Parish Council did a 'walk and talk' 10 years ago when this was raised and no action had been taken. The Chairman apologized and undertook to look into it; an offer of a meeting with the parishioner was not taken up due to his work commitments. However, on investigation it would seem that the area where the high kerbstones are belongs to the Aster Group and residents should raise the issue with them. A plan showing the extent of Wiltshire Council's responsibility is available on request but it is only as far as the first corner, by number 24

Parish Council accounts: the accounts are available on the website (aveburyparishcouncil.org) under the Governance tab and on request from the Parish Clerk, (clerk@aveburyparishcouncil.org). There is a statutory period of 6 weeks for any person to request to see the accounts.

Tree belt at Rawlins Park: Cllrs. Bedford and Lewis will continue to raise this at their regular meetings with the National Trust.

Our new PCSO, Emily Johnson, attended the meeting and residents wishing to contact her can either attend the quarterly drop in sessions at the Social Centre or via email on emily.johnson@wiltshire.police.uk). There is also the nonemergency number of 111, or in the case of an emergency, people should always call 999. The next drop-in session will be 18th December in the evening

Other items discussed were:

Planning applications for tree works - one was supported at the meeting and the other after a site visit by Cllr. Lewis

It was decided to use the Scribe accounting system for Parish Councils this will make our financial information more transparent and easier for parishioners to view as well as easier for the Clerk to manage the budget

Solstice arrangements for the Ridgeway – it was felt that this was such a large issue it needed more time to consider than is available in Parish Council meetings and that we should have a separate meeting to discuss the matter as well as possibly polling local residents.

#### **HEDGES & TREES**

Now the evenings are getting darker earlier, and the leaves will soon start to fall please can you remember to cut back hedges & tree branches. This is vitally important on land bordering roads and pavements as the leaves become very slippery when wet and the overhanging hedges force pedestrians into the road where they may not easily be seen by oncoming vehicles. Please do not be surprised if you receive a letter from the Parish Council making this request but we hope by giving you a gentle reminder now this can be avoided.

#### **SOLSTICE**

#### **Permits**

Kennet Valley Parish Council have been advised that it will be required to issue

permits for any of its parishioners from West Overton, Lockeridge or Fyfield who may have a need to use the shops or other services at Avebury during the Solstice period. This is due to a change in procedures introduced by Wiltshire Council.

Please note this is **NOT** a permit for attending the Solstice celebrations. Reasons for requiring a permit may be for visiting residents in the High Street, the Community Shop, Post Office, Henge Shop, National Trust, Church, Social Centre etc. The permits usually cover a day or so either side of the actual Solstice, depending on the traffic restrictions imposed.

### **Delving into Avebury Manor's past**

You might have seen in this month's Wiltshire Life Magazine that we've been working with *Findmypast* to pull back the curtain on life at Avebury Manor at the beginning of the twentieth century. This has brought some fascinating stories to life at the time of the 1921 Census.

There are six people shown as living at Avebury Manor in 1921. Described as head of the household is Lieutenant Colonel Leopold Jenner (aged 51). Living with Leopold are his wife, Nora Jenner (aged 52), two domestic servants – Agnes Eliza Chivers (aged 35) and Martha Annie Swatton (aged 20) – and Agnes' two children, Kathleen Olive and Cyril Chivers, aged 6 and 3.
