View from the Rectory

It is the middle of August and parish life is in full swing albeit with cautious consideration of the current state of the pandemic. On Sunday one of my stalwart Churchwardens announced that it was my last service at that particular church for three months and in that moment the long-anticipated research leave became a reality. The needs of the parishes have largely outweighed the preparations for 'going on the road' and my heart did a flip at the list of meetings, paperwork and conversations that needed attention for each of these strands of my life. It felt as if I had a foot in the 'now and the not yet' and had to be 100% in each in this short month of transition. Then I drew breath and relaxed. The 'now' and the 'not yet' is both familiar and challenging: it is where all of us are, all the time, and all we need to do is be fully present in the moment and keep one eye on the road ahead, and do what we can as best we can with that moment.

It struck me that this perhaps is when the most learning happens, when we are fully alive to and attentive to the vagaries of life; fully present, having paused to reflect and take stock and seek God's direction and guidance for the journey.

So what am I taking stock of right now? I found myself meditating on the story of the sending out of the 72 disciples (**Luke 10:1-1.**) To be a disciple simply means to be a 'learner'.

In the time of Jesus you learnt from people rather than books and I suspect I will learn a great deal about myself, about God, and about how people feel about being connected to the Divine as I hear their stories. Starting conversations with people, being invited into groups of people you have never met before can make one feel risky and vulnerable. Being willing to share my own story and in particular the deepest belief I have - that God is Love, and that this Love, that transcends all Love, simply wants them to know they are loved and are precious and valued - is also risky. Coming back to all of you changed by these encounters with others and challenged by what I learn about myself is risky too. But when we share stories of our faith in the context of vulnerability and weakness, with a sense of dependence on others, remarkable things happen: strangers become friends, bridges are built and barriers come down.

Jesus sent his disciples to 'all the places that he wanted to go' and I have a feeling that not only is Jesus doing this journey alongside me but he is also sending me to where he is already ahead of me and will also be here with all of you in your journey – in the 'now and not yet' of absence and change. Wherever we encounter the presence of God, we enter the meeting point of heaven and earth, and my prayer for you and me and all those I may encounter on the way is that in our story connecting with their story, we learn more about HIS story and, as we journey on, together and apart, with God alongside us, we make history. The 72 returned with joy to tell the story of those they encountered. I take heart in Jesus' promise that, whatever challenge or hardship we find in the task, we will come back together at Christmastide, to hear what happened and rejoice.

May God bless you all.



AVEBURY SOCIAL CENTRE

As many of you will have now noticed the entrance porch to the Social Centre has now been fully refurbished and is looking very smart. The work was a little more comprehensive then first envisaged due to problems with the fixing of the original roof tiles so that the entire roof of the porch had to be replaced rather than one or two tiles. The chairman has requested that any future users of the hall refrain from pinning or sticking any posters or notices to either the external porch door or walls! The hall has been well used over the last month since the end of restrictions with art classes, meditation group, art and craft exhibition and Teas for Tourists to raise funds for Winterbourne Monkton Church. The Trustees hope that local residents benefit from many of these activities as well as those from outside the area and it is pleasing to see substantial funds raised to help the upkeep of our churches. It is certainly a welcome relief to have the hall back in use to the extent prior to the lockdowns and in September the WI resume their evening meetings in person and

Berwick Bassett and Winterbourne Monkton Parish Council

The past year or more has been fairly busy for the Berwick Bassett and Winterbourne Monkton Parish Council. We are now in the final throes of finalising the introduction of the speed limit between Beckhampton and Winterbourne Bassett from 60mph to 50mph (excluding Avebury of course where the limit is 30mph.) The task seems to have taken forever but I am told campaigns only started some 55 years ago! Additionally we have had elections and, of more immediate interest, a while ago we were "gifted" a Community Hall which will back onto the Church of St Mary Magdalene to be built within the Rivar development on The Old Dairy, Winterbourne Monkton.

During this time discussions have been progressing between Wiltshire Council, Rivar and the Parish Council to finalise the hand-over from Rivar to BBWMPC. Hopefully this will all be completed in September and a brand new Community Hall, which is earmarked for the benefit of

the Parish Community, will become a reality!

In the meantime work has been on-going. Although the Community Hall will be bare bones (i.e. still in need of tables, chairs, curtains etc.) there is already a steering committee in place putting together a plan that will cover the soft furnishings and other equipment to make the hall a viable and attractive asset to the two villages and, hopefully, also, garner interest from further afield for the benefit of both the parish, the church and, most importantly, the residents.

A recent local survey conducted within the two villages found that there was unanimous agreement that the hall would be an asset to the villages and a long list of possible ventures and activities that could be introduced to educate, entertain and even help maintain the fitness of the residents were suggested.

At present we are looking at a mix of Social, Educational, Entertainment and Fitness opportunities as well as offering the use of the hall for general meetings and get-togethers which will help cover the running costs of the hall and allow for re-investment into the hall and maintain a continuous programme of upgrading facilities and availability. The Community Hall has parking (albeit limited to 18

cars), toilets and a small kitchen area. The hall will be able to seat 60 people theatre style – but obviously less if tables or floor mats etc., are to be used.

From the survey conducted high on the wish-list from residents was Keep-fit (in a variety of options), Film Nights, Mother and Baby/Toddler groups, Coffee mornings, table sales and Art classes amongst many other suggestions. However these can only happen with help and assistance. So in addition to keeping you up-to-date on what is happening in the Parish this is also a crie-de-coeur for volunteers to help make the project a success, for anyone who would like to run classes (fitness, art, Zumba, Yoga, Pilates, music) in the hall, and any organisation who would like to use the hall for whatever reason. This could be a regular mother and baby/toddler group, Scout/ Guide Meetings the only limit is your imagination!

Over the next month we would hope to circulate/publish a list of charges and finalise the booking system but, in the meantime, if you are interested in hiring, helping or setting up a regular class please do contact the Parish Council through bbwmpc@gmail.com.

News from August 2021

Hello from Kennet Valley School! As you can imagine all of the staff and children are currently enjoying their summer holidays these are always well deserved but I feel that this is particularly true after our 2020/21 year with all the ups and downs of Covid! We were very pleased that, although the school closed at times due to lockdowns, we didn't need to close either of our bubbles at other times. I do believe that this was mostly down to luck in reality, but I am very grateful to all of the staff who kept our hygiene practices tight and to the children and parents who followed all of the guidelines that we gave to them. Throughout the entire year the children were amazing, and it was always great when we could have everyone in school.

Summer Plans

As many of you know, our Friends Association has been working for several years to raise money for our playground to be updated. Just before the summer we received news that our planning permission had been granted so we have been able to start the process of the rebuild.

This started by the old equipment being taken away. I know that I speak for the whole school when I say a HUGE thank you to the Hues family, who came in the holiday to clear the site ready for the next step. We are really looking forward to this family joining the school in September and are incredibly grateful for the help that they have already given to us.

We then had the new playground markings put down for the children to enjoy when they return to school on the 2nd September. These marking include a running path, a clock and games that the children can play. While the playground was being painted, the first of the new equipment was also put in. This is a wooden play train – especially for our younger children to use. It was all very exciting, and I am absolutely thrilled by these new additions. We are expecting the rest of the equipment to be put in during September and we cannot wait for this to happen.

While writing I wanted to use the opportunity to say a massive thank you to everyone who has helped to raise the money for the school playground update. It is such an exciting prospect for the school, and I know that the children at the school will be ecstatic when the whole playground is finished.

I would also like to say a enormous thank you to Mrs. Humphries (a parent at the school and local villager) who has been the driving force in the whole process of the playground development.

Our Staff

Earlier in the year I wrote to you all about Mrs. Watts, our ELSA and TA. I thought that I would give you some information about another of our TAs – Mrs. Alexander. Mrs. Alexander is a trained primary school teacher and works as a Teaching Assistant at the school. Because she has a teaching qualification, she is also able to work as a HLTA (Higher Level Teaching Assistant) at times in the school too. This means that she does all the things that regular teaching assistants do but at times she has an increased level of responsibility - Mrs. Alexander can teach classes on her own, as well as cover planned absences and allow teachers time to plan and mark. When I asked Mrs. Alexander about her

When I asked Mrs. Alexander about her role at the school she said "Before my children were born, I trained as a primary teacher but took time away from work to be a stay-at-home mum with my daughters. When my youngest daughter started school, I wanted to do something that would work around the school run so I volunteered at Kennet Valley. I started by listening to children read a couple of times a week but that quickly grew into helping across the classrooms when needed.

Two years ago, I officially became a fulltime member of the Kennet Valley team as a teaching assistant and have been in the reception/year I class ever since. As a qualified higher-level teaching assistant, I also cover PPA in Kingfishers class and if a teacher is away or on a course, I will cover their classes too.

I have particularly enjoyed helping to set up continuous provision in Wrens class. This is a new way of teaching through play, small group work and structured activities which are all largely child led. Although it has been a challenge, it has been a huge success and I am looking forward to developing this further and extending the outside provision to broaden the children's life skills such as safely using woodwork tools as well as extending their academic understanding. Over the last year I have been working closely with teachers from other schools to deepen my phonic knowledge so that I can run booster groups to support children as needed with their early reading, writing, and spelling. I love working at Kennet Valley and being part of such a supportive team. The last 18 months have been tough for everyone, but the Christian ethos of the school teamed with the strong community spirit has enabled the children to thrive despite the challenges Covid has thrown at us. I hope everyone has had a fun, safe summer and I'm looking forward to hearing all about the children's adventures when we are back in September.

I am very lucky to have a great team at Kennet Valley and Mrs. Alexander is a very important member of this. I would like to take this opportunity to say a BIG thank you to Mrs. Alexander for all her hard work and commitment to this vital school role.

I will continue to write to you about the

staff at the school in the coming months so that you know more about us all.

New School Year

All of the staff have been busy preparing for the new school year and I know that they are looking forward to seeing their classes again on the 2nd September (1st September is a TD Day).

We are very excited about welcoming new children to the school – not only in our reception class but in other year groups in the school – and we are welcoming a new member of teaching staff to the school. I am sure you will join me in welcoming everyone to our community.

One of the most attractive local places to walk is surely the Pewsey Downs, which afford stunning views from Milk Hill, Walkers Hill, Knap Hill and Martinsell Hill out over the green spaces of the Pewsey Vale towards Salisbury Plain. The Pewsey Vale Tourism Partnership is now in the process of applying to gain Walkers are Welcome accreditation, and they need our help. They must prove to the WaW organisation that there is sufficient local interest in the scheme by obtaining 700 or so signatures of people living in and near Pewsey, and so far they have approximately 600. Becoming a Walkers are Welcome community brings many benefits to the economy and environment for both locals and visitors. Kennet Valley Hall the beginning

The history of Kennet Valley Hall is now on the Hall's website www.kvh.org.uk/KVH%20History/ History.pdf

For your interest here is a short extract from the early part of the document

Exploring the history of KVH takes us back nearly a Century, and on the way exposes major changes in the social history of the local villages. In the early part of the 20C life was hard with most people working on, or servicing local farms. An original Wages book of the farms operating in the local villages identifies that on October 2nd 1924 there were 80 farm workers employed locally. The working day was very long with little time for leisure. Even so, various social or religious organisations existed and invariably meetings took place in the homes of the gentry or ministers of local religious organisations, or the local schools. In due course the idea of creating a central meeting place for these organisations was conceived and as a result, the first "Kennet Valley Hall" was born.

Records show that "on 6th March 1931 Mr Frank Swanton of Overton, Nr Marlborough in the



County of Wiltshire donated a parcel of land forming part of South land on the RHS as you walk from Overton Farm".

Quote:

"The land was for a "Parish Hall" to be used for the purposes of physical and mental recreation and social, moral and intellectual development through the medium of reading and recreation rooms, library, lectures, classes, recreations and entertainments or otherwise as may be expedient for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Parish of Overton-cum-- with East Kennett and its immediate vicinity without distinction of sex or political the Hall in 1931 was £475 or other opinions subject to the provisions of these premises"

This statement became the basis of the hall's Constitution and remains the same today

The site referred to was a plot of the centre of West Overton towards the church. There is now a modern house on the site aptly named "The Old Hall" Fourteen organisations banded themselves together as sponsors and a Committee of Management was formed comprising a representative nominated by each of them. Erection of the building was carried out by Messrs.G. Sprules and Son, of Lockeridge, and a loan debit on the project was finally cleared as a result of a fete held in 1934.


