A View from the Rectory

'Feed my Sheep'

The instruction given to Peter by the shore of Galilee, just after the post-resurrection Big Breakfast, resonates deeply after a summer of wildfires, droughts, and heatwavesand not just literally feed in the physical sense. I have found myself questioning the media and news feeds, the governmental 'spin', the perspectives of news reporting, the Facebook debates around global warming and climate change and the reporting from conferences and events such as the Lambeth Conference. It seems to me that we are being fed cynicism and fear, instead of the bread of community cohesion and unity we saw develop across the pandemic. Fear and cynicism breeds paralysis, crushes hope and increases 'self-first' and ultimately destroys our common shared humanity. In the pandemic we rallied around the vulnerable, recognising our own vulnerability, and we truly rejoiced in the smallest of things that brought us a glimmer of light in the darkness. I wonder if we have lost a bit of perspective on how much we can do to change things even when they seem hopeless. I wonder if we need to rediscover how much we are able to do together instead of swallowing the poor offerings that sap our resilience and corrode our courage. I have been doubly challenged this week and as we enter an autumn and winter to rival the previous 'winters of discontent' reflect deeply on the visit of Bishops from Sudan to our benefice. In the end, fewer than three bishops ended up in St James Avebury and each told a similar story.

Imagine living somewhere repeatedly destroyed every time you rebuild, imagine living apart from spouse and children, rising daily in a war-torn drought ridden land to tend your garden to provide the food to feed them in a refugee camp in neighbouring Uganda. Can you contemplate an existence where what your people most need are tools and seeds, clean water and access to communication via solar powered computers, medical care and education for children who have lived lives barely free from the violence of civil war? Even very basic needs are not being met and yet the resilience, hope and community spirit of the Bishops and their flocks is extraordinary and I feel we have much to learn from the way in which they continue to defy the reality of a situation which could truly overwhelm them with despair. They choose Hope and reach out to ask for Hope and to offer Hope.

The economic and climate crisis, and the continuing impact of war in Ukraine on us all is not to be underestimated, however, we need to be freed from fear if we are to pull together through the coming winter. How? By challenging how we are responding to what it is we are hearing, asking ourselves what is it we CAN do, and how we might work better together – and as Peter did, go out and go on to make a difference where we can.

Keep an eye out for leaflets, posters, messages on social media giving information on support available, opportunities to come together as a community and other initiatives for the coming winter and if you are able to offer more in the way of feeding than being fed, give what you can to support the most in need, wherever they are. 'Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread'. So true, on all kinds of levels.

Carer Support Wiltshire

If you look after, or help to look after, someone who could not otherwise live independently without your support, then you are an unpaid carer. You might be caring for a partner, parent, child, friend or neighbour who is elderly, has a disability or an illness – including a mental health illness or an addiction to alcohol or drugs.

If you look after someone you love or care about you might not consider yourself a carer. Caring is something we do often without question, or the need for a label. But it can be useful to acknowledge your role so that you can ensure you're receiving all the support available to you and taking care of your own needs.

Carer Support Wiltshire offers advice and support to those who are caring for someone. This often starts with an assessment to determine what impact a carer's role is having on their own health and wellbeing. They run a number of groups and carer cafes where carers can meet up and offer support to one another. These groups can help with feelings of loneliness and isolation that many carers experience. There is always a member of CSW staff or a trained volunteer on hand to answer any questions you may have and often there are guest speakers too. Reflection from the **Lambeth Conference 2022**



To all licensed clergy, LLMs and those holding PtO

Not many gatherings of global impact come round once in a decade. Even World Cups and Olympics appear more regularly. This Lambeth Conference came fourteen years after the last one due to the pandemic, and so coming together was always going to be both more joyful and more complex. The world in which we now live and the uncertainty we are all sharing in is a challenging backdrop for conversation and fellowship.

Issues of poverty, war and the climate crisis took centre stage, within the theme of 'God's Church for God's World', and a clear call from Archbishops Justin and Stephen to place discipleship at the heart of the church's mission. Above all, being able to come together in worship, prayer, and conversation across some 165 different countries was both an extraordinary privilege and a spur to action. Small groups enabled a deeper sharing, where trust was grown, and stories (often of courage, resilience, and hardship) were shared as an appreciation of one another's context grew.

The Anglican Communion is not one church but a family of churches who belong to one another in mutual love and a shared heritage. It is not a command-and-control structure: more a family with all those familiar joys and complexities of family life. We believe the Anglican Communion has been strengthened by this Lambeth Conference, as has our cherished link with Sudan and South Sudan and are delighted that some of our brothers and sisters are able to join us in the diocese this week.

You will have seen much comment and counter-comment about the deliberations. We have found it striking how much external reporting did not represent the mood or the content from within the conference. The conversations, mostly in our small groups, over meals and refreshment breaks, were respectful, robust, and set always within the context of meeting under God and in the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus was named as Lord of us all. We spent much time reflecting on 1 Peter and his call to place our trust in Jesus, to offer hospitality and to live in a spirit of generosity.

Regarding issues around sexuality and inclusion, these conversations were set in the broader context of Human Dignity and the important matters of slavery, human trafficking, abuse and violence against women and girls. While strong differences were evident, there was a continuing commitment to listening, learning, and loving those marginalised.

As your bishops, we are committed to the Living in Love and Faith process in which the Church of England is currently engaged and believe that process to have integrity and hope for all as a way forward. We wish to affirm the gift of LGBTI+ people in and for the church: God's love welcomes and embraces all.

One of the most remarkable and memorable moments was when we prayed the Lord's Prayer together - each in their own language. These familiar words became a joyful cacophony of difference and yet all ending together with one voice in a great Amen. It seemed like a vision of heaven.

We have come away from Canterbury feeling hopeful for the future as together the members and churches of the Anglican Communion rejoice in our similarities and our differences, gathered around the Lord and Saviour of us all, Jesus Christ.

- an elector of the local council; or in the past 12 months occupied land or other premises in the area the local council serves (as owner or tenant); or work in the area local council serves (as your principal or only place of work); or live within three miles of the local council boundary.




