A View from the Rectory

September has arrived early, the little faces of visitors to the Rectory mid-August smeared with blackberry juice -'and they were THIS BIG', I was told. Elderberries changed colour overnight a month too early and I was forced to review the timing of 'putting down' the elderberry cordial cold cure and brought it forward. Simon - I have a bottled earmarked for you!) What in heaven's name was going on? I asked, and a farmer said 'Dunno, but I at this rate I feel we are in for a very cold winter'. I think he may be right.

I love September weather. Crisp, misty dawns with a hit of cold dew or heavy frost, warm rich sunshine that gilds the trees with copper and gold, deep blue skies and evenings long enough still to linger, but needing the odd fire to keep the cold at bay. It speaks to me of twilight days, where preparations for the coming dark and cold begin, and there is an abundance in the air that is a haunting prelude to winter slumbering trees. It also speaks to me of the normal cycle of life and my part within it. I ponder what it is we bring from the season of summer to lighten the darkness of the midwinter, just as we bring the best parts of our lives well-lived into the presence of the Creator of Al, l having travelled the dark corridor of death and emerged in the light of a new dawn and a new day.

I found myself remembering a dear friend whose struggle with what she called 'the God stuff' was epic. Shortly before her 'Autumn' as she called death, she said everything she had chosen for her funeral contained something of her journey through life into the twilight years and for me to listen to the words of the final hymn. Her coffin was draped with autumn leaves, sheaves of wheat replaced flowers and apples, and other orchard fruits adorned every window ledge. Her readings were unusual, the Presentation of Jesus in the temple, and a raucous poem from her youth that jarred. Then the last song as she was taken out. And I knew. In the September days of her life, she had found herself drawing close to the maker of the trees, the leaves and the blackberries, and she said, in essence, I know and I trust! Her message not to be afraid of the autumn days of life or the descent to winter for it brings a promise - this:

Birds flying high, you know how I feel Sun in the sky, you know how I feel Breeze driftin' on by, you know how I feel It's a new dawn It's a new day It's a new life for me, ooh And I'm feeling good. *Nina Simone*

News from the National Trust: Sept. 2023

We have quite a few updates this month, including a couple of invitations, so grab a cuppa and read on ...

Excavations in Avebury Manor Parkland

The National Trust recently teamed up with the Universities of Southampton and Bournemouth for excavations in Avebury Manor Parkland.

Professor Josh Pollard, University of Southampton, who led the excavation, says that these excavations were quite speculative in nature. Other than adjacent Medieval earthworks, it wasn't evident at the start that any archaeological features or deposits would be found; but the proximity to the henge earthwork and the manor suggested this could be an interesting area to investigate.

While limited in scale, the excavations produced a wide range of finds, including Mesolithic worked flints, Saxon and Medieval features, and a scatter of 17th-18th -century pottery, clay pipes and animal bone, the latter relating to recreational use of this area during the time of the manor. The big surprise, given how close to the henge we were, was the near-total absence of Neolithic finds. The results of the work offer valuable insight into the long-term development of prehistoric and later Avebury.

Josh will be giving a talk about the excavation later in the year, we hope to be able to announce the date in the next newsletter.

LoGa Culture project

We are really excited to be a partner in a new three-year research project with Southampton and Bournemouth Universities. The project, called LoGa Culture, brings together the European academic leaders in digital locative experiences, to explore how a new generation of innovative locative games might benefit people through cultural heritage sites.

Locative games are applications or websites accessed on smartphones, with content and interactions that are triggered by locations.

For instance, this could mean that if someone was exploring the henge, when they reached a certain point, they could hold up their smartphone and see, through the phone, how people were digging the henge bank in Neolithic times or raising the stones.

The experience is one of mixed reality, combining digital images and the real place. This technology can take the form of digital tours, narratives, locative literature, or interactive puzzles and can enable visitors to see places 'with new eyes', revealing hidden aspects and creating new types of interaction.

Avebury will provide two key case studies for the research project (the others being in Germany, Ireland and Portugal), one in the wider landscape and one in the monument itself. The project will use these new technologies to allow Avebury and its remarkable landscape to tell its own fascinating story in new and innovative ways, engaging a wide range of audiences, whilst communicating our conservation messages and increasing the understanding of the importance and fragility of the site.

As a first step, our research partners will be carrying out more work into understanding our visitors and other audiences, using a mix of different survey tools. So, if you see people in and around the monument with clipboards or postcards and a big smile, it might be them. Please feel free to engage with them and take part in the survey yourself.

We'll share more information about this exciting project with you as it develops. In the meantime, please contact eva.stuetzenberger@nationaltrust.org.uk with any questions.

Starting with the 1921 Census, the team have researched the people who were living and working here during this dramatic period in history. From owners Leopold and Nora Jenner, to live-in domestic servants Martha and Agnes, and the groundsmen Benjamin and William.

To preview the new interpretation that will tell these stories in the manor, the team are holding a talk for volunteers and the local community on Friday 8 September at 10am.

The AGM of the Centre took place on Thursday 20th July 2023. The Chairman Tony Farthing reviewed the year and outlined the number of repairs and issues that had arisen. Hopefully most of these had now been addressed and while the roof leak had caused major concern the remedy had not been as costly as first feared, there was however the ceiling repairs and other possible building work to be addressed. On a more positive note the Village lunches had been very successful as was the village

Panto that would now have four performances in December due to demand! Ruddigore had been much enjoyed as had local talks on apples and garden birds. Members of the Committee were thanked – in particular Mrs Sandra Hues who was stepping down as Rainbows no longer meet Mr Jonathen Guest was voted on the Committee as a new Trustee.

Plans for the future; include upgrading the heating, future village lunches and performances/talks and the need to expand the number of users of the hall. It was agreed that the **50**th celebration of the

formation of the Avebury Social Centre would take place on Wednesday 15th November 2023 6.30 – 8.30 pm. Nibbles and drinks will be served for Village residents to enjoy.

Finally, may we remind users that it is requested users notices are NOT pinned to the external doors or walls of the building (there is a notice board available) it damages the door and paint work and is something you would not do to your own front door!

Avebury Parish Council

At our July meeting our newest member, Mrs. Sue Millward, formally joined the Council by signing the acceptance of office papers. Having advertised, as required, we are able to co-opt a new member which we will do in September. Two local residents have put their names forward

We reviewed a planning application for 1, Chapel Corner Cottages and agreed that a site visit would be in order to consider the works to be carried out. This has now taken place and the Parish Council was happy to support the application.

Traffic enforcement units have been active in the Parish, running speed checks at the Club and on the corner outside Elements. The data from our two SIDs has been sent to the Police who are using it to inform these checks. The road monitored during

the exercise is a 30 mph and the fastest vehicle was tagged and captured at 47 mph. Eight drivers were flagged as exceeding the speed limit and depending on previous convictions and history, 7 drivers will be offered a speed awareness course, 1 driver will be given £100 fine and receive 3 penalty points.

Solstice was reviewed and, although it was thought to be a calmer, quieter and enjoyable event, there were still issues around trespass, illegal parking and the parking permit scheme. APC will continue to work with the National Trust and the Police to try and resolve these issues for future Solstices.

Parish Steward Scheme

Our Parish Steward now comes once a month for a whole day – increased from a half day – to carry out maintenance and repair in the Parish. To make sure that he is usefully employed we need to know of any problems as soon as they arise.




